Preface

Facts & Trends is designed as a basic reference document with admissions, financial aid, enrollment, persistence, graduation and outcomes, degree, semester credit hour, faculty and staff, research, and financial information for the nine academic and six health-related institutions and The University of Texas System as a whole. This document is intended to provide accurate and consistent information for internal use and for the general public, and as a statistical supplement to the UT System Accountability & Performance Report. For the most part, data are reported for the most recent six years to identify trends over time.

Data maintained by the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board have been used extensively in this publication. However, these data may vary somewhat from information presented and used internally by individual System institutions due to differences in management information systems, data definitions and intended application.

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General Analysis – Admissions and Financial Aid

U. T. System is committed to access and affordability for college bound students in Texas. Admit rates, the percent of students who applied and were admitted, are over 70% at most academic institutions. Financial assistance is available to students with need through tuition set asides and guaranteed tuition programs. Since tuition deregulation, students and faculty are increasingly involved in the tuition setting process and are developing flexible tuition plans that meet the needs of their institution and community.

Admission Trends

Overall, U. T. System academic institutions (excluding U. T. Brownsville) received 62,769 applications, admitted 42,820 students and enrolled 21,182 first-time undergraduates in fall 2008. The admit rates ranged from 50.3% at U. T. Austin to 98.6% at U. T. El Paso, and the ratio of admits to those who actually enrolled ranged from 44.2% at U. T. San Antonio to 55.9% at U. T. Pan American.

The percent of first-time enrolled students from Texas who were in the top 10% of their high school class at U. T. Austin increased to 75.8% in fall 2008. At other U. T. System institutions, the top 10% represented one third or less of first-time enrolled students from Texas.

From fall 2004 to fall 2008, average SAT test scores for entering freshmen increased by 10 or more points at four U. T. System academic institutions (U. T. El Paso, U. T. Pan American, U. T. Permian Basin and U. T. San Antonio), while ACT test scores increased at three institutions (U. T. Austin, U. T. Pan American and U. T. San Antonio).

Average GRE test scores for entering graduate students increased by 10 or more points at six U. T. System academic institutions (U. T. Austin, U. T. Brownsville, U. T. Dallas, U. T. Permian Basin, U. T. San Antonio and U. T. Tyler). Average GMAT scores also increased at the majority of the institutions. LSAT test scores increased slightly at U. T. Austin.

Financial Aid

Based on actual fee bills in fall 2008, the average total academic cost for resident undergraduates at academic institutions ranged from \$2,598 at U. T. Pan American to \$4,647 at U. T. Dallas. For health institutions, the average total academic cost for resident undergraduates ranged from \$1,574 at M. D. Anderson to \$4,205 at the HSC-San Antonio.

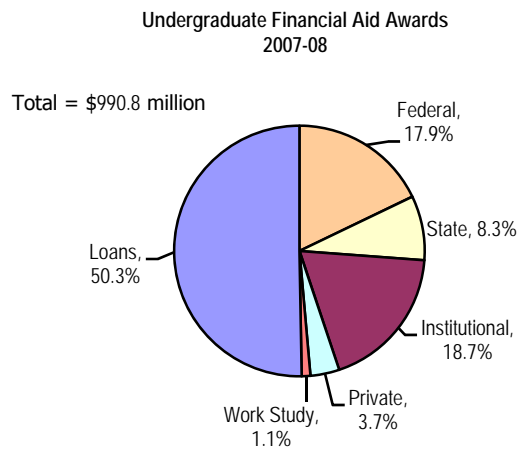
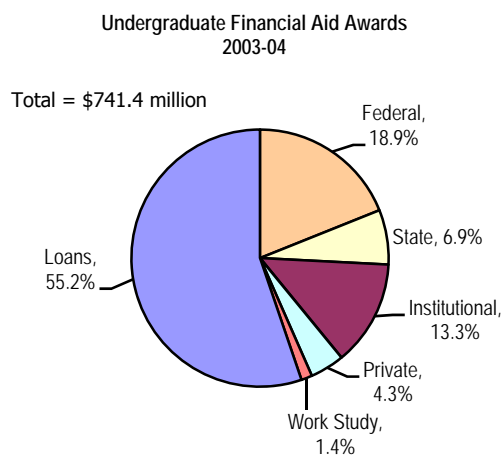
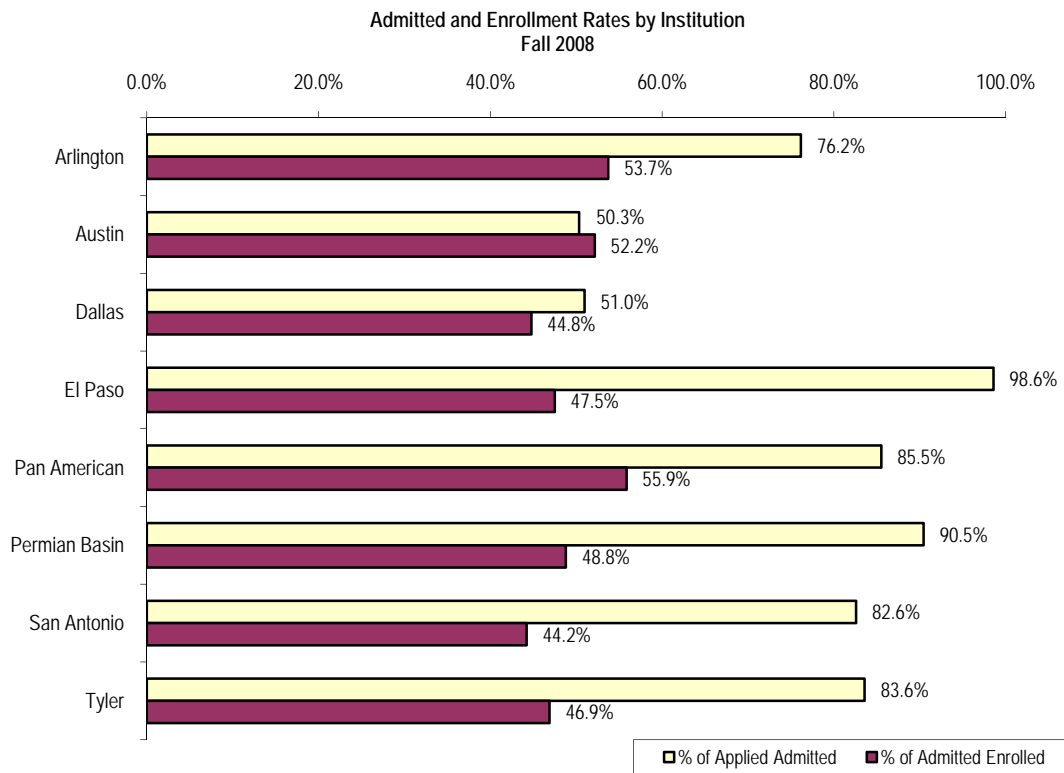
For academic year 2007-08, the U. T. System average total academic cost was \$7,074. Almost half of full-time undergraduate students received need-based grant aid (48.8%). For these students, the net cost (after aid) was \$1,713, a discount of almost 76%. Applying this amount of aid across all full-time undergraduate students, the average net cost would have been \$4,456, a discount of 37%.

The number and total amount of undergraduate financial aid continues to increase at all U. T. System academic institutions. In 2003-04 there were 225,874 undergraduate awards totaling around \$741.4 million. In 2007-08 there were 284,206 awards totaling \$990.8 million, an increase of 25.8% and 33.6%, respectively.

From 2003-04 to 2007-08, as a result of tuition set asides and increasing institutional support,

- the number of institutional awards increased from 55,657 to 77,325, an increase of 38.9%
- the total amount of institutional awards increased from \$98.4 million to \$185.1 million, an increase of 88.1%
- institutional awards, as a percent of all financial aid increased from 13.3% to 18.7%

General Analysis – Enrollment

In 1999 the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board (THECB) published the first *Closing the Gaps (CTG)* report and challenged colleges and universities in the state of Texas to increase the number of students participating in higher education. U. T. System met this challenge by increasing both the number and diversity of its student body by the first benchmark in 2005. In order to meet the 2010 target of 201,909 students, total enrollment at U. T. System must increase by approximately 2% per year for the next two years.

Enrollment Trends

In fall 2008, total enrollment at U. T. System institutions was 195,107 students, an increase of 17,431 students (9.8%) from fall 2003 and 908 students (.5%) from fall 2007.

- Enrollment at academic institutions was 183,226, an increase of 15,592 students (9.3%) since fall 2003 and 579 students (.3%) since fall 2007.
- Enrollment at health institutions was 11,881, an increase of 1,839 students (18.3%) since fall 2003 and 329 students (2.8%) since fall 2007.

The proportion of undergraduate enrollment at U. T. System academic institutions increased slightly from 79.3% in fall 2003 to 80.9% in fall 2008. At the health institutions, the proportion of graduate students increased from 39.0% to 41.9%, while the proportion of professional students decreased from 40.2% to 37.7%.

Overall, gender distributions at U. T. System remained fairly steady, with male enrollment around 46% and female enrollment around 54%. The proportion of women attending the health institutions decreased slightly from 61.3% to 60% in fall 2003.

As the population of Texas became more diverse, ethnic distributions at U. T. System institutions also changed from fall 2003 to fall 2008.

- System-wide, the percentage of white students decreased from 43.2% to 37.8%.
- At the academic institutions, the proportion of African American students increased from 4.8% to 5.7%, and the Hispanic population increased from 35.4% to 40.0%.
- At the health institutions, the proportion of African American students increased from 5.5% to 6.7% and the International population increased from 6.8% to 11.8%.

First-time Undergraduates

Enrollment of first-time undergraduates at the U. T. System academic institutions increased from 22,390 in fall 2003 to 23,141 in fall 2008, an increase of 3.4%. In fall 2008, first-time undergraduates are predominantly female (52.2%), full-time (94.9%) and non-white. Between fall 2003 and fall 2008, the proportion of white students decreased from 38.7% to 34.2%, while the proportion of African American students increased from 4.3% to 6.3%, Hispanic students from 43.5% to 44.6% and Asian American students from 9.6% to 11.3%.

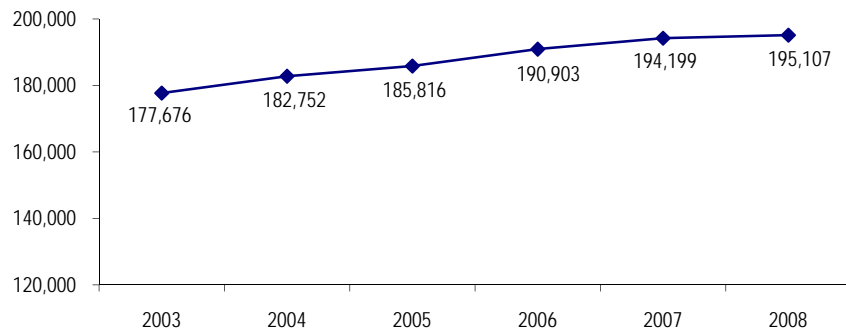
Transfers

Transfer enrollment has remained relatively unchanged since fall 2003. There were 12,547 undergraduate transfers entering U. T. System academic institutions in fall 2008.

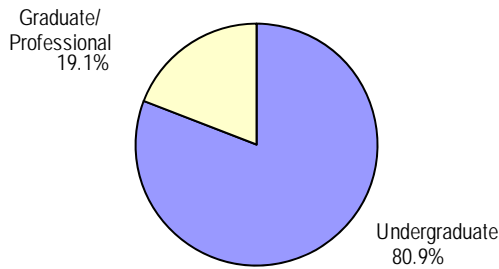
In fall 2008, transfer students are predominantly female (53.2%), transferred from a Texas community college (65.5%), and are ethnically diverse. About 42.5% of transfers are white, 33.7% are Hispanic, 8.8% are African American and 8.2% are Asian American.

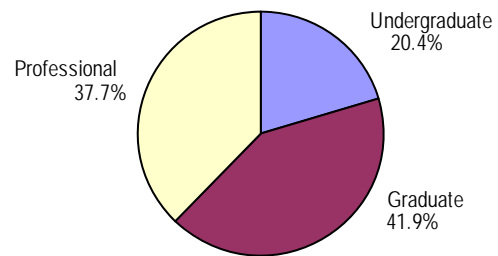
**U. T. System Total Enrollment
 Fall 2003 to Fall 2008**



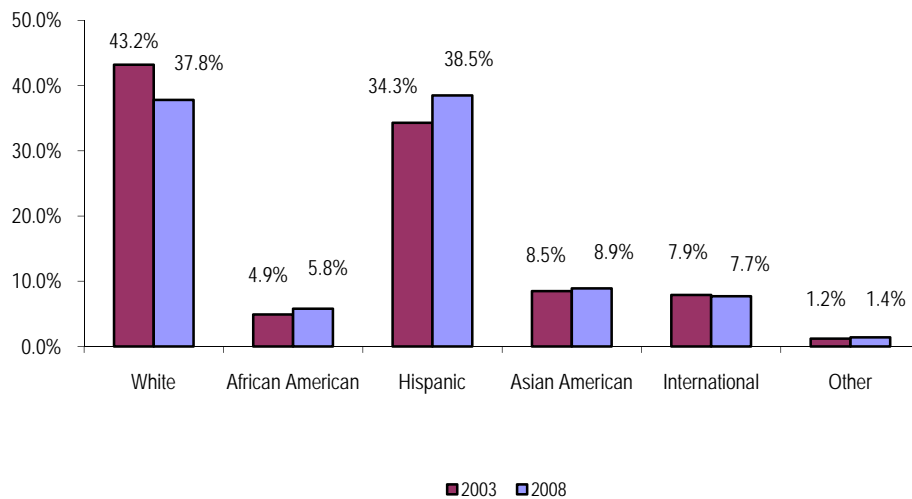
**Enrollment by Level

General Analysis – Persistence, Graduation and Outcomes

In February, 2006, the U. T. System Board of Regents passed a resolution making the improvement of graduation rates one of its highest priorities for the next decade.

The U. T. System Graduation Rate Improvement Initiative called for the nine academic institutions to set graduation rate targets for 2010 and 2015. These targets were approved by the Board of Regents in May 2006. While the impact of this initiative cannot be fully measured until the entering class of fall 2006 graduates, most institutions are already improving their graduation rates.

First-year persistence is an early indicator of student success. Based on a comparison of the entering classes of 2002 and 2007, first-year persistence rates for first-time, full-time degree-seeking undergraduates increased for three institutions:

- U. T. El Paso, from 69% to 70%
- U. T. Pan American, from 66% to 71%
- U. T. Tyler, from 54% to 65%

Based on a comparison of the entering classes of 1997 and 2001, the most current information available, six-year graduation rates from the same institution increased for these five institutions:

- U. T. Austin, from 71% to 78%
- U. T. El Paso, from 26% to 29%
- U. T. Pan American, from 26% to 33%
- U. T. Permian Basin, from 29% to 34%
- U. T. San Antonio, from 28% to 30%

Graduation rate effectiveness can also be measured by the percentage of students who graduate or persist at any Texas institution of higher education. These rates are especially important for students who enter under the Coordinated Admission Program (CAP) and are expected to continue their studies at another U. T. System institution. The six-year composite graduation and persistence rates from the entering class of fall 1997 to the entering class of fall 2001 increased for these seven institutions:

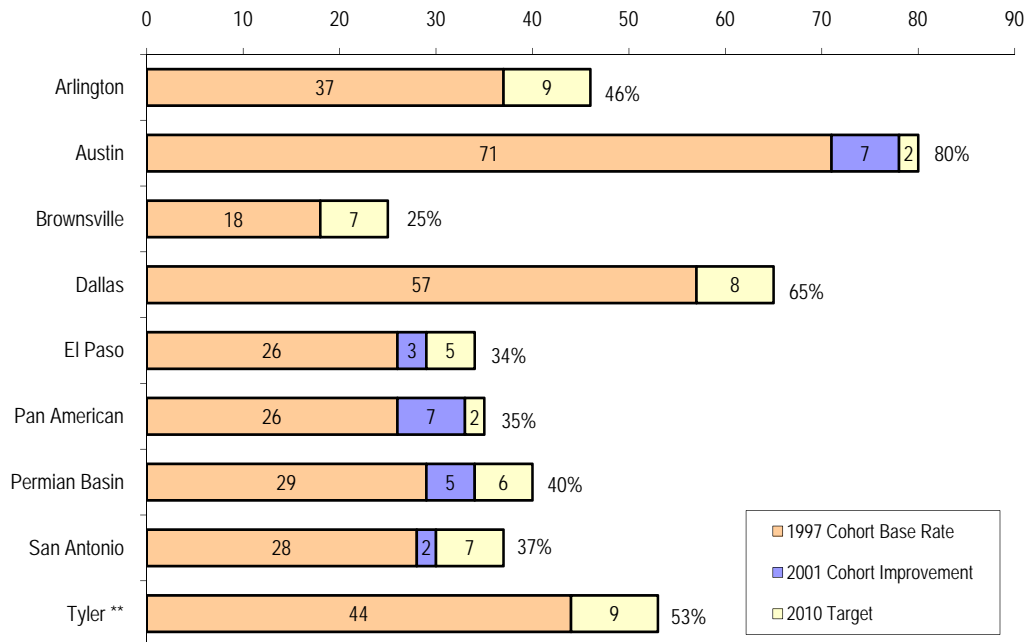
- U. T. Arlington, from 62% to 65%
- U. T. Austin, from 82% to 86%
- U. T. Dallas, from 73% to 79%
- U. T. El Paso, from 52% to 55%
- U. T. Pan American, from 53% to 57%
- U. T. Permian Basin, from 57% to 58%
- U. T. San Antonio, from 57% to 61%

Improving the graduation rates of students who transfer from a community college is also a priority of the U. T. System. A community college initiative has been developed in an effort to streamline and enhance the pipeline from community college to universities. The four-year graduation rates for community college transfer students entering U. T. System academic institutions with 30 or more credit hours in fall 2004 were:

- Over 40% - U. T. Arlington (46.4%), U. T. El Paso (42.7%) and U. T. Tyler (48.9%)
- Over 50% - U. T. Permian Basin (51.5%) and U. T. San Antonio (53.0%)
- Over 60% - U. T. Austin (68.0%), U. T. Dallas (62.0%), U. T. Pan American (61.2%)

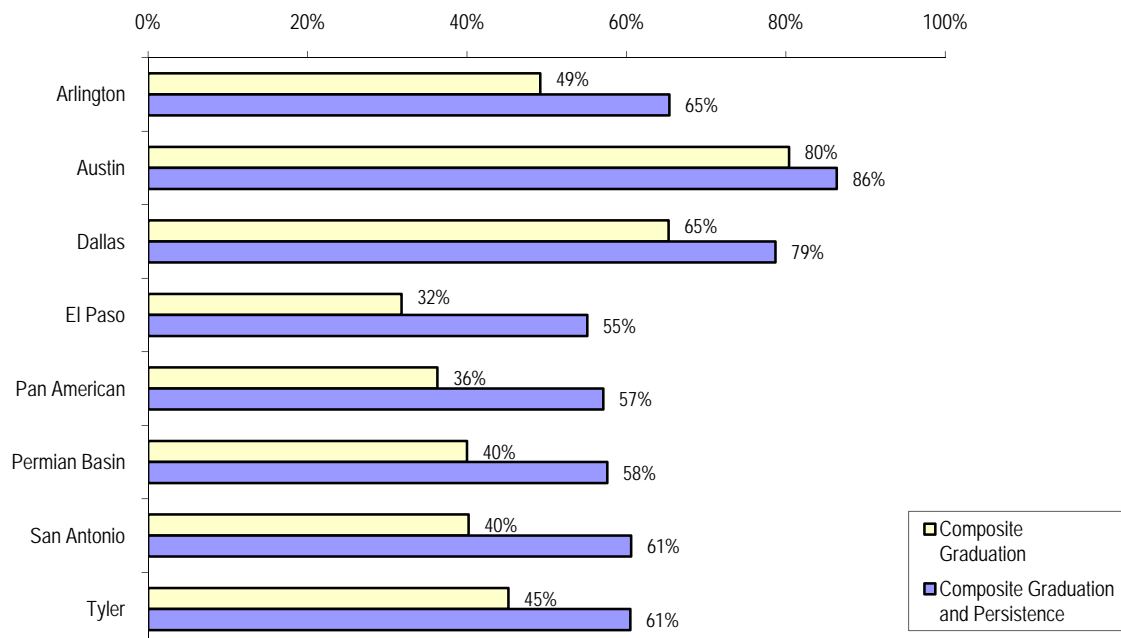
Progress to Six-Year Graduation Rate Targets

General Analysis – Degrees and Certificates Awarded

System institutions produce over one-third of the degrees and certificates awarded by public universities and over two thirds of health care degrees and certificates awarded by health-related institutions in Texas.

In 2007-08, U. T. System institutions awarded 40,303 degrees and certificates, an increase of 7,710 degrees or 23.7% over the 2002-03 academic year.

- The number of degrees and certificates awarded at the academic institutions increased from 29,893 in 2002-03 to 36,891 in 2007-08, a 23.4% increase. Degrees awarded at the doctoral level grew at the fastest rate, 50.9%.
- At the health institutions, the number of degrees and certificates awarded increased from 2,700 to 3,412, a 26.4% increase over the same time period.

Overall, around 56% of the awards went to women, about the same as the previous year. At the health institutions, the growth rate of degrees and certificates awarded to women was 31.8% from 2002-03 to 2007-08, compared to an 18.2% increase for men.

- In 2007-08, women earned 57.1% of baccalaureate degrees at the academic institutions and 70.9% of the certificates and baccalaureate degrees at the health institutions.
- At the graduate/professional level, women earned 51.0% of the awards at academic institutions and 58.1% at health institutions.

System-wide, the proportion of degrees and certificates awarded to African American, Hispanic, Asian American students increased over time, while the proportion awarded to white students decreased. In 2007-08, over half of the awards were to non-white and International students with Hispanics receiving more than one-fourth of the total awards (29.0%).

- At the undergraduate level, non-white and International students earned 55.0% of the degrees at academic institutions and 43.8% of degrees and certificates at the health institutions.
- At the graduate/professional level, non-white and International students earned 53.4% of the degrees and certificates at academic institutions and 44.1% of degrees and certificates at health institutions.

With an increased emphasis nationally in the areas of science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM), U. T. System contributed to these degrees at every level. In 2007, 22.0% of baccalaureate, 21.3% of master's and 48.8% of doctoral degrees awarded at U. T. System academic institutions were in a STEM field. Overall, more than one out of five degrees awarded at U. T. System academic institutions was a STEM degree (22.7%), a higher percentage than other public universities in Texas (18.0%) and the nation (18.5%).

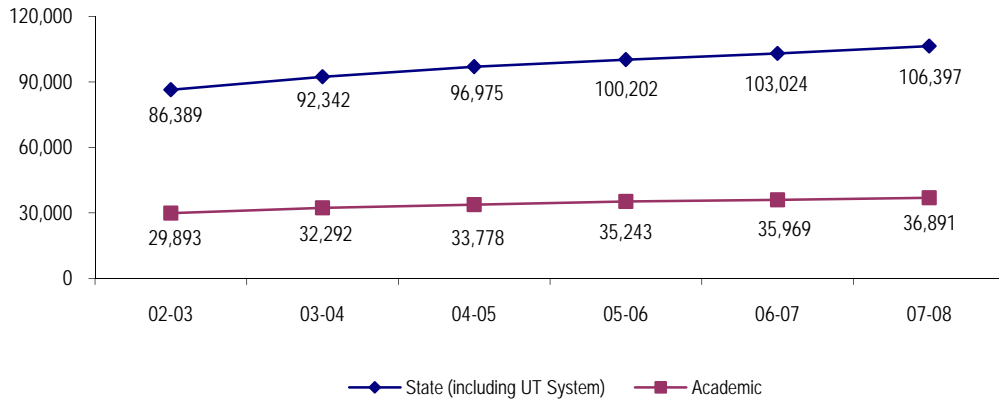
UT System institutions increased the number of health professional degrees to meet growing demands within the state. The number of nursing degrees awarded at the academic and health institutions increased by 35.1%, from 1,566 in 2002-03 to 2,116 in 2007-08.

- At the academic institutions, baccalaureate degrees in nursing increased from 712 to 984 (38.2%) and master's degrees in nursing increased from 144 to 217 (50.7%).
- At the health institutions, baccalaureate degrees in nursing increased from 528 to 612 (15.9%) and master's degrees in nursing increased from 173 to 240 (38.7%).

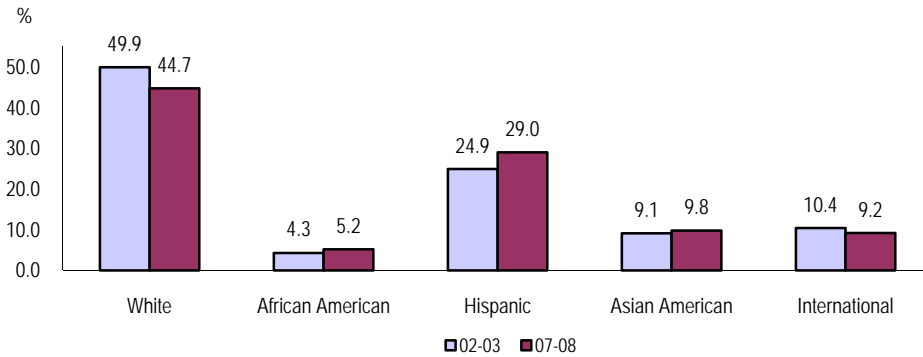
The health institutions also significantly increased the number of degrees in Health Professions, formerly Allied Health, (Master's, by 68.4%) and Biomedical Sciences (Doctoral, by 34.8%) from 2002-03 to 2007-08. The number of professional medical degrees increased from 749 to 804 (7.3%), while the number of professional dental degrees decreased by 8.4%, from 154 to 141 during the same period.

Degrees and Certificates Awarded

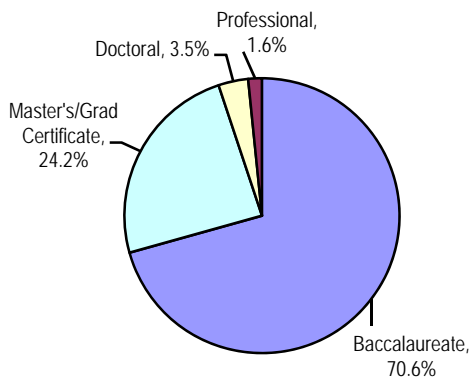
Total Degrees and Certificates Awarded at U. T. System Academic Institutions

 AY 2002-03 to 2007-08



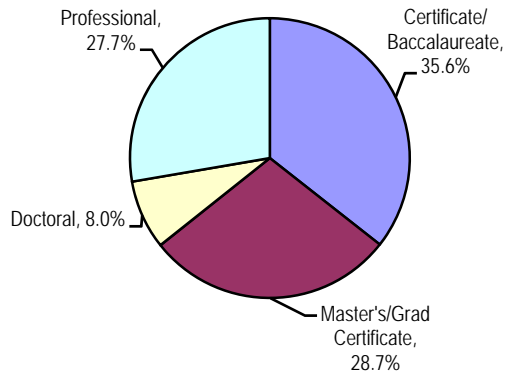
U. T. System Degrees and Certificates

General Analysis – Semester Credit Hours (SCH) and FTE Students

From fall 2003 to fall 2008, the number of semester credit hours taught at U. T. System academic institutions increased from nearly 1.9 million to more than 2.0 million, a 8.7% increase*. Most of this increase occurred at the undergraduate level, growing from 1.5 million to 1.7 million semester credit hours, or 10.1%.

- The number of masters hours increased from 184,131 to 189,549 (2.9%).
- The number of doctoral hours increased from 53,372 to 56,923 (6.7%).
- The number of professional credit hours decreased from 27,742 to 24,161 (-12.9%).

From fall 2003 to fall 2008, the number of faculty increased at a faster rate than enrollment. This resulted in lower student to faculty ratio at seven U. T. System academic institutions in fall 2008:

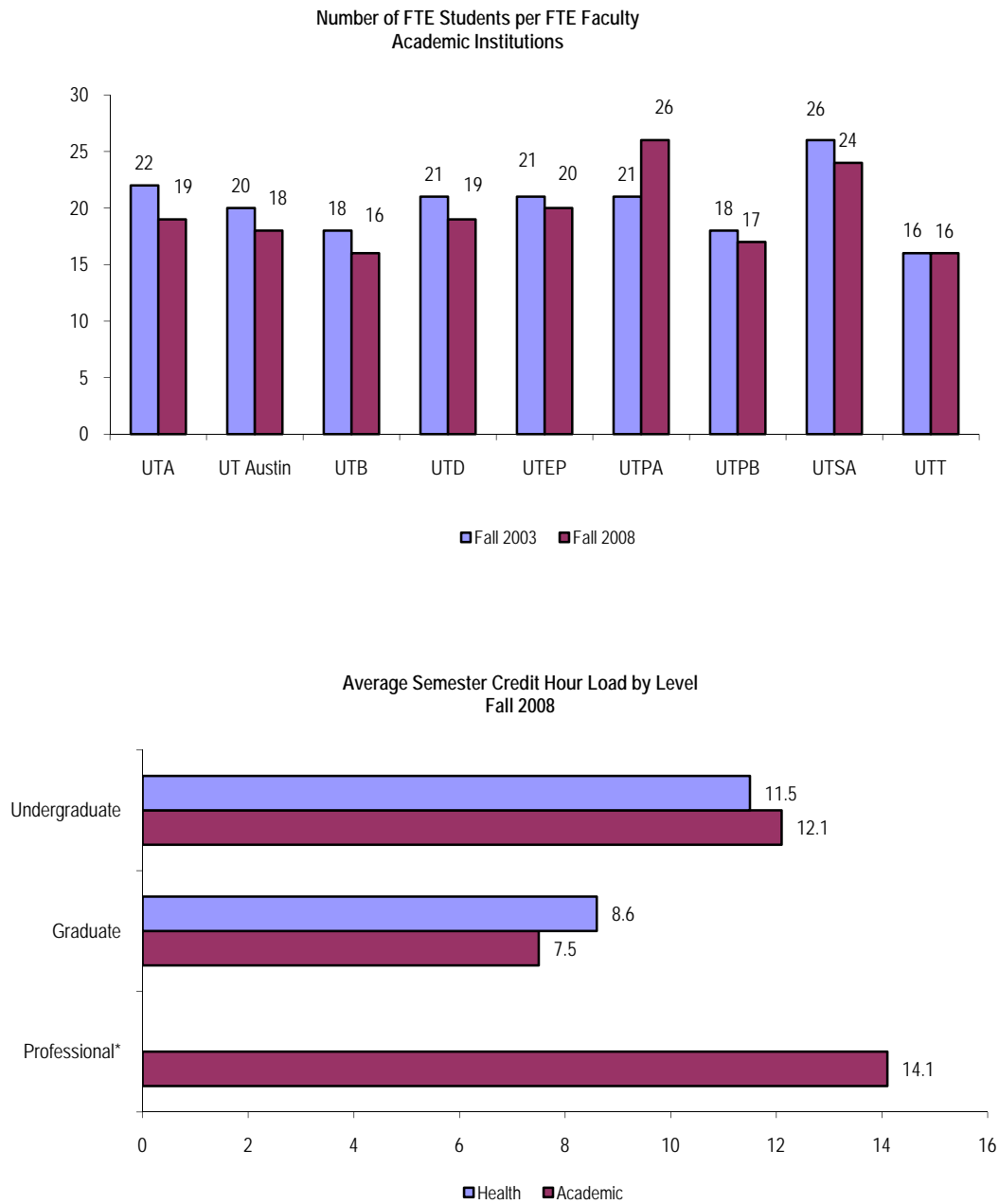
- U. T. Arlington (19:1), U. T. Austin (18:1), U. T. Brownsville (16:1), U. T. Dallas (19:1), U. T. El Paso (20:1), U. T. Permian Basin (17:1) and U. T. San Antonio (24:1)
- U. T. Pan American has the largest ratio student/faculty ratio at 26 to 1, resulting from a shift in faculty member assignments to include research and public service and less direct instruction.

Undergraduate students at the academic institutions are taking more semester credit hours. From fall 2003 to fall 2008, the average SCH for undergraduate students increased from 11.9 to 12.1. The average SCH stayed the same at the graduate level, 7.5 semester credit hours.

- The average undergraduate credit load increased at U. T. Austin, U. T. Brownsville, U. T. Dallas, U. T. Pan American, U. T. Permian Basin, U. T. San Antonio and U. T. Tyler.
- At the health institutions, the average credit load for undergraduate students decreased slightly from 11.6 in fall 2003 to 11.5 in fall 2008 and the average SCH also decreased slightly for graduate students, from 8.9 to 8.6.

General Analysis – Faculty and Staff

To keep pace with enrollment and research growth, U. T. System institutions employ an increasing number of faculty and staff each year.

From fall 2003 to fall 2008, the number of faculty employed by U. T. System institutions increased by 20%, from 15,022 to 18,027.

- At the academic institutions, the number of faculty increased from 8,267 to 9,946, a 20.3% increase, driven primarily by enrollment and research growth.
- At the health institutions, the number of faculty increased from 6,755 to 8,081, or 19.6%. The increase in health faculty was driven by enrollment increases and the expansion of research and clinical care activities at these institutions.

Following a national trend, the proportion of faculty in tenured/tenure-track positions (professor, associate professor, assistant professor and instructor) is decreasing, from 46.0% in fall 2003 to 42.1% in fall 2008.

Although the majority of faculty at U. T. System are men, the overall proportion of women increased between fall 2003 and fall 2008, from 37.3% to 40.2%.

- At the academic institutions, the proportion of women faculty increased at all levels; from 24.1% to 25.6% for tenured women, from 38.6% to 42.5% for tenure-track women, and from 48.6% to 51.5% for other professional women.
- At the health institutions, the proportion of women faculty also increased at all levels. The proportion of tenured women increased slightly from 23.0% to 24.4%, tenure-track women increased from 31.6% to 34.4%, and other professional women faculty increased from 43.0% to 44.4%.

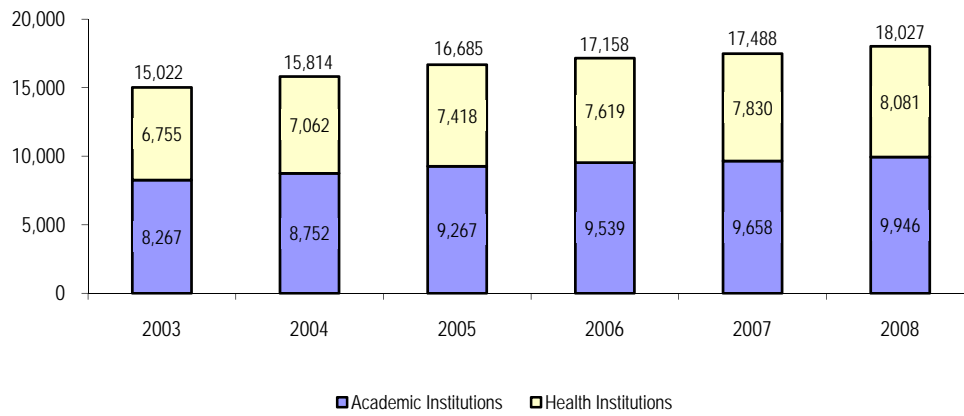
Faculty employed at both the academic and health institutions were slightly more diverse in fall 2008 than fall 2003.

- Within the academic institutions, the proportion of white faculty declined from 73.5% in 2003 to 69.2% in 2008. The representation of most of the non-white ethnic groups increased during this same time period. The proportion of African American faculty increased slightly from 2.5% to 2.9%, Hispanic faculty increased from 13.7% to 15.3% and Asian American faculty increased from 7.3% to 8.8%. The percentage of International faculty increased from 2.6 percent to 3.0 percent and the percentage of Native American faculty remained about the same at less than 1%.
- At the health institutions, the proportion of white faculty decreased from 70.6% in 2003 to 64.2% in 2008. The Hispanic faculty increased from 6.8% to 7.7%, Asian American faculty from 17.6% to 21.0% and International faculty from 1.7% to 3.4%.

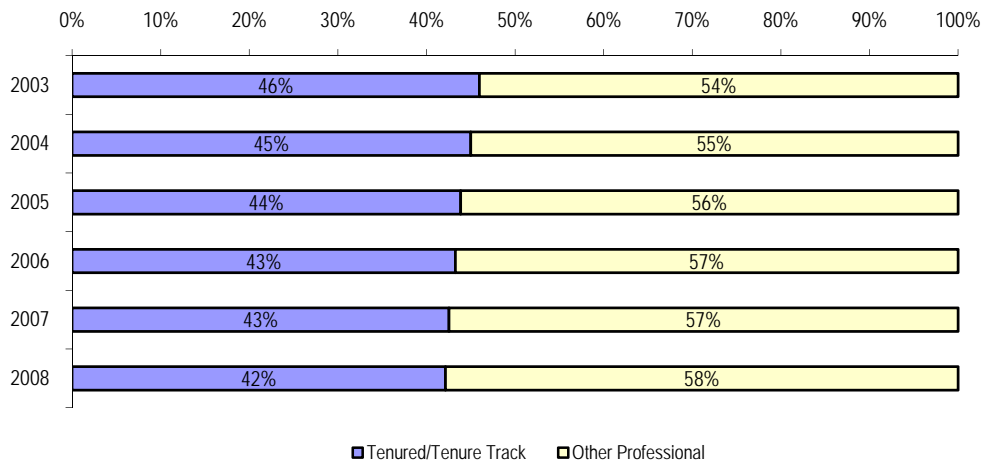
In fall 2008, there were 6,189 administrative staff, 60,025 other non-faculty staff and 20,212 student employees employed by U. T. System institutions. From fall 2004 to fall 2008, administrative and non-faculty staff increased from 58,319 to 66,214, a 13.5% increase. Student employees increased from 18,446 to 20,212, a 9.6% increase.

General Analysis – Research

Research is not only a measure of faculty innovation, competitiveness and productivity, but also an economic driver for Texas. U. T. System research expenditures from all sources were \$2.17 billion in FY 2008. Federal research expenditures increased by 26.0 percent, from almost \$976 million in FY 2004 to \$1.23 billion in FY 2008.

- Between FY 2004 and FY 2008, total research expenditures increased by almost \$175 million at M. D. Anderson, \$145 million at U. T. Austin and \$64 million at U. T. Health Science Center – San Antonio.
- In FY 2008, federal research expenditures accounted for 56.7 percent, private research expenditures accounted for 19.3 percent and state expenditures accounted for 17.0 percent of total U. T. System research expenditures.
- Between FY 2004 and FY 2008, federal research expenditures increased by 43.4 percent at academic institutions and by 17.6 percent at health institutions.

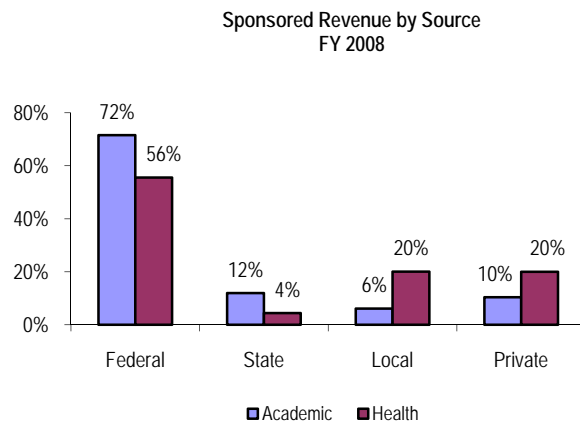
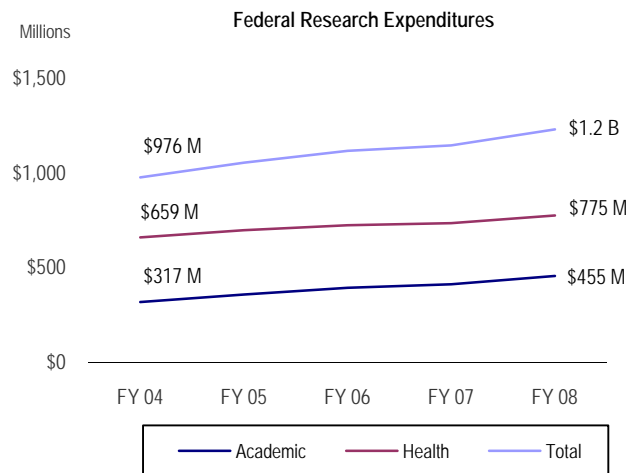
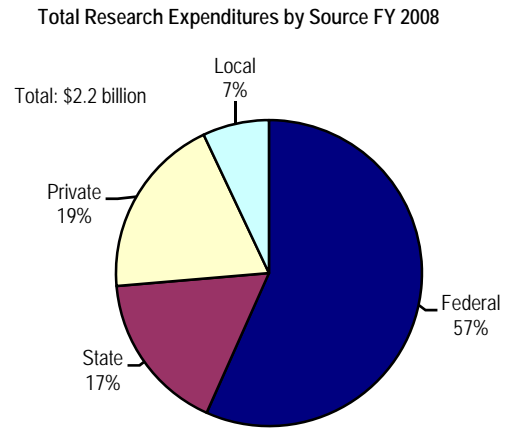
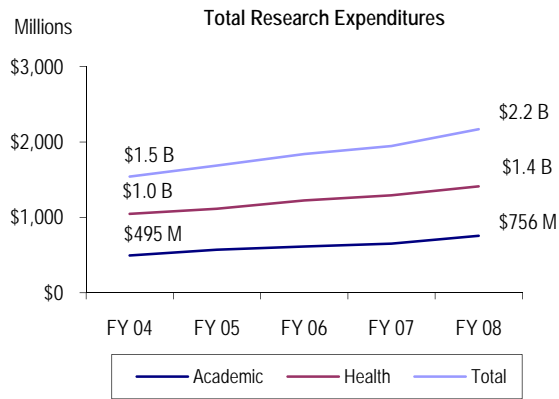
Sponsored revenue is a more comprehensive measure of an institution's overall success in securing funding to support research, public service, training and other activities. In FY 2008, U. T. System institutions received more than \$2.44 billion from all sources, an increase of 27.3 percent from \$1.92 billion in FY 2004.

- Sponsored revenue received from federal sources accounted for 61.9 percent of the total while 14.5 percent came from local sources, 16.2 percent came from private sources and 7.4 percent came from state sources.
- Between FY 2004 and FY 2008, sponsored revenue at health institutions increased by 24.7 percent and increased by 31.5 percent at academic institutions.

Another measure of research productivity is the number external research grants held by tenured and tenure-track faculty, the percentage of faculty holding such grants and the average number of research dollars per full-time equivalent (FTE) tenured/tenure-track faculty. At the U. T. System health institutions, research grants are also held by non-tenured research faculty.

- Between FY 2004 and FY 2008, the number of research grants increased at seven of the nine academic institutions and the percentage of tenured and tenure-track faculty holding grants also increased at six of the nine institutions.
- In FY 2008, more than one-third of the tenured/tenure-track faculty held research grants at U. T. Arlington, U. T. Austin, U. T. Dallas, U. T. El Paso, and U. T. Permian Basin and research expenditures per FTE tenured/tenure-track faculty averaged more than \$100,000 at each of these institutions except U. T. Permian Basin.
- Research expenditures per FTE tenured/tenure-track faculty increased at every health institution between FY 2004 and FY 2008 and averaged over \$350 thousand at five of the six health institutions in FY 2008.

General Analysis – Finance

Major revenue sources for U. T. System institutions include state appropriations, government grants and contracts, tuition & fees for the academic institutions, and sales and services of hospitals for the health institutions.

The percent of revenues from state appropriations continues to decline relative to total revenues.

- In FY 2008, state appropriations accounted for 24.1% of the academic institutions' revenue, down from 27.4% in FY 2004.
- State appropriations accounted for 14.3% of the health institutions' revenue in FY 2008, down from 16.4% in FY 2004.
- When adjusted for inflation, state appropriations per full-time equivalent (FTE) student decreased between FY 2002 and FY 2008 at every academic institution except U. T. Permian Basin.

In fall 2008, the largest categories of expenses for all U. T. System institutions are hospitals and clinics, instruction, institutional support and physical plant, and research.

- From FY 2004 to FY 2008, operating expenses for hospitals and clinics increased 40.2%, from \$2.04 billion to \$2.87 billion; instruction increased 27.3%, from \$1.9 billion in FY 2004 to \$2.43 billion; institutional support and physical plant expenses increased 85.5%, from \$971 million to \$1.8 billion in FY 2008 (some of this increase was a result of a change in post employment benefits reporting requirements in FY 2008); and research expenses increased 41.0%, from \$1.21 billion in FY 2004 to \$1.71 billion.

Prior to the economic downturn in fall 2008, endowments for the U. T. System increased 48% between FY 2004 and FY 2008.

- For the academic institutions, endowments increased from \$5.16 billion to \$7.56 billion from FY 2004 to FY 2008, a 46.6 percent increase, and by 60.3 percent from \$1.9 billion to \$3.1 billion for the health institutions.

Donor support increased for U. T. academic and health institutions between FY 2004 and FY 2008.

- Donor support increased at seven of the nine academic institutions and total donor support increased from \$315 million in FY 2004 to \$360 million in FY 2008, a 14.4 percent increase. Donor support increased at three of the six health institutions and total support increased from \$334 million in FY 2004 to \$440 million in FY 2008, a 31.8 percent increase.

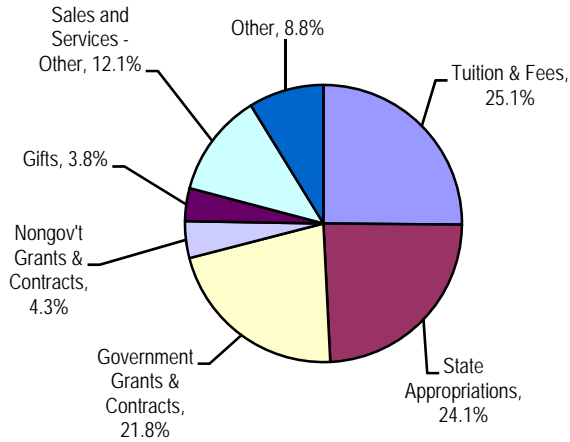
U. T. System health institutions generate revenue from hospital patient care. Faculty also provide a significant amount of unsponsored charity care in state-owned and affiliated facilities.

- Patient care revenue in FY 2007 was \$3.38 billion, an increase of 75.2 percent over FY 2003.
- Total charges for unsponsored charity care provided by U. T. System faculty and hospitals were over \$1.3 billion in FY 2007.

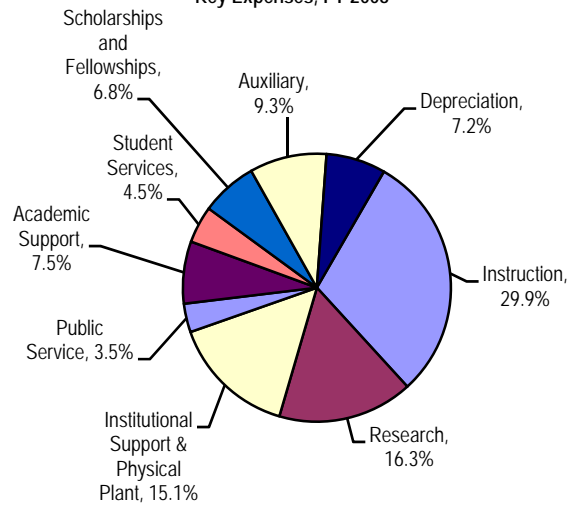
The amount of money expended for administrative costs relative to total expenses was 7.0% for academic institutions and 5.7% at health institutions in FY 2008.

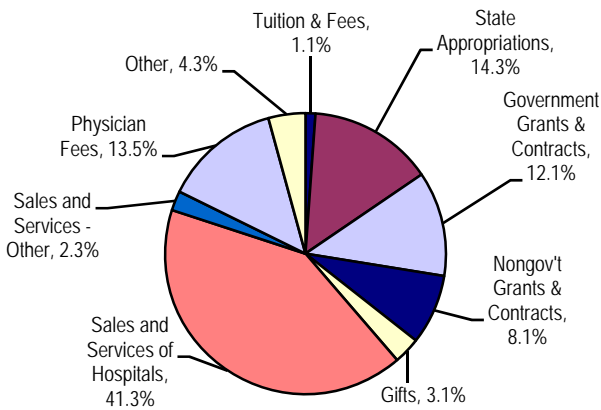
Academic Institutions
 Key Revenues, FY 2008



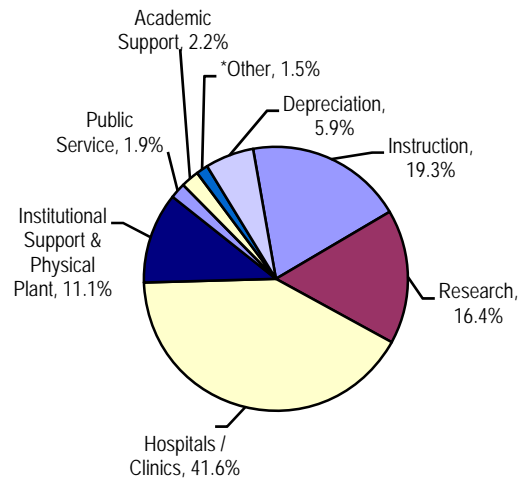
Academic Institutions

 Key Revenues, FY 2008

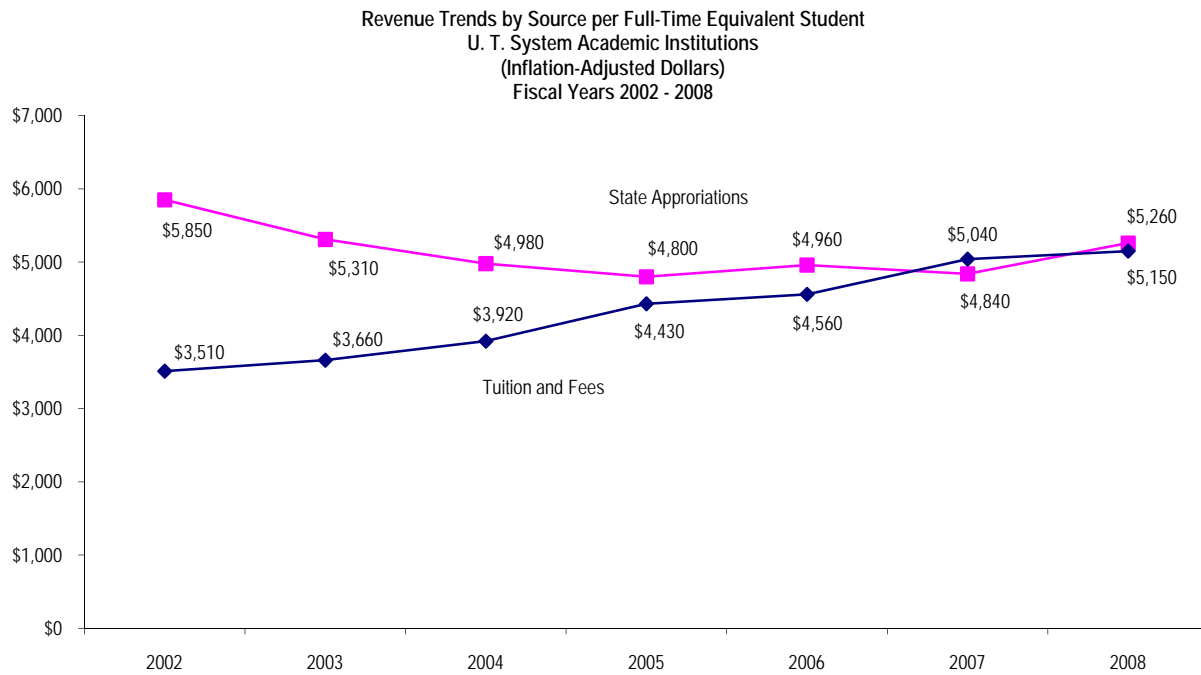


Health Institutions

The System is not required to fund the OPEB liability; instead, the difference between the OPEB cost and the System's contributions to the plan will increase the unfunded actuarial accrued liability.
