REPORT OF AMENDMENTS TO THE 1966-67 CENTRAL ADMINISTRATION BUDGETOffice of Investments, Trusts and Lands and Board for Lease of University Lands

1. Change the status of Miss Thelma Lockwood effective January 1, 1967 from Executive Assistant to Administrative Services Officer and increase her annual salary rate from \$8,520 to \$8,880. Source of Funds: Available University Fund Unallocated Operating Account. Miss Lockwood is budgeted two-thirds time in the Office of Investments, Trusts and Lands and one-third time in Board for Lease of University Lands. (RBC# 38, 39, 40)

2. Transfer \$152 from the Available University Fund Unallocated Operating Account to Office of Investments, Trusts and Lands to provide funds for a salary increase for Mrs. Maxine R. Dean, Administrative Secretary, from an annual salary rate of \$4,800 to \$5,028 effective January 1, 1967. (RBC# 38, 41)

OTHER FISCAL ITEMS

1. Transfer of Funds within Appropriation for New Geology Building at the Main University

Certain changes were recently made in the use of some rooms in the New Geology Building at the Main University in order to enlarge the offices to be occupied by the Chairman of the Geology Department. These changes made it necessary to provide additional furniture for this space, and it is desired to issue a change order which will add \$9,985.99 to the contract with Abel Contract Furniture and Equipment Company for Furniture and Furnishings for this building. There is enough money remaining in the allocation for furniture and furnishings for this building to cover this addition, and it is, therefore, recommended that the sum of \$9,985.99 be transferred from Account No. 85-9043-0099 - New Geology Building - Allotment Account to Account No. 85-9043-0181 - New Geology Building - Furniture and Furnishings Contract - Abel Contract Furniture and Equipment Company, Inc.

Grant AF-AFOSR-778-67, by which the Department of the Air Force, Office of Scientific Research, Arlington, Virginia, provides \$38,424.00 for support of research entitled "The Reactions of Molecules in Excited Electronic States with Paramagnetic Gases." The subcontract is effective for the period September 19, 1966 through June 30, 1967, and the research will be performed under the direction of Dr. Stephen J. Gage, Assistant Professor of Mechanical Engineering.
8. Supplemental Agreement No. 1 to Subcontract No. 2812, by which the Union Carbide Corporation, Oak Ridge, Tennessee, deletes Article 20, Patent Indemnity, from the "Terms and Conditions" of the subcontract. The research on nuclear dual-purpose desalination plant dynamics continues under the direction of Dr. Stephen J. Gage, Assistant Professor of Mechanical Engineering.

ACADEMIC CONTRACTS: The following contracts have been executed at Main University by the official indicated. I recommend approval and ratification of signatures:

1. Interagency Contract No. IAC(66-67)-306 with the Abilene State School, signed by Business Manager James H. Colvin, whereby the University through its Division of Extension will conduct a supervisory training unit in human relations for personnel of the Abilene State School (under the control and management of the Texas Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation). The contract is in force from December 5, 1966, through April 14, 1967, and total reimbursement to the University is not to exceed \$450.
2. Interagency Contract No. IAC(66-67)-307 with the Texas Industrial Commission, signed by Business Manager James H. Colvin, whereby the University will furnish services and materials for use in advertising and disseminating information to out-of-state prospects for industrial expansion. The period of the contract is December 7, 1966, through August 31, 1967, and total amount to be paid the University is not to exceed \$5,000.
3. Interagency Contract No. IAC(66-67)-309 with the Texas Education Agency, signed by Business Manager James H. Colvin, whereby the University through its Division of Extension will sponsor and conduct an intensive two-day seminar for approximately 24 professional staff members of the Agency who have major leadership responsibilities for instructional planning. The period of the contract is December 19, 1966, through January 31, 1967, and the total amount to be paid to the University is not to exceed \$225.

BUSINESS CONTRACTS: Business Manager James H. Colvin has signed an amendment to the contract dated August 15, 1963, between the Neelley Vending Company and the Ex-Students Association, acting through Campus Services, Inc., which increases as of January 1, 1967, the price of milk, chocolate milk, buttermilk, and orange drink in half pint cartons from 10¢ to 15¢ with commission to the University remaining at 10%. The present wholesale price for homogenized milk in one-half pint cartons is 8-1/4¢ and for chocolate milk in the same quantity, 9¢, making it impossible to continue to vend these items for 10¢.

(3) Professor M. Van Winkle to serve as consultant to the Monsanto Company in regard to research, pilot plant, and plant problems in the fields of separations technology.

(4) Associate Professor Kenneth B. Bischoff to act as consultant to Esso Research Laboratories, Baton Rouge, Louisiana, in the broad area of chemical reaction engineering concerning any of the processes used by Esso.

FACULTY LEGISLATION: The following legislation has been passed by the General Faculty and/or Faculty Council. I recommend approval.

1. The Faculty Council at its meeting of November 21, 1966, approved proposal of the Department of Required Health and Physical Education for Women to give advanced placement examinations in that area. (D&P 3787-88 - substitute pages.) The proposal stems from a recommendation of the Committee on Educational Policy after a study of the Departments of Required Health and Physical Education for Men and Women which states in part:

The Committee believes that there should be a more systematic approach to screening and directing students to activities that will enhance their physical skills, similar to advanced standing examination in academic subjects . . . It is possible that a few students could be excused from the requirement on a basis of a demonstrated proficiency in two or more activities with a carry-over value.

Presently students are required to take four semesters of Physical training, and are excused only for reasons of health, participation in ROTC (men), or exceptional hardship. This legislation would make it possible for women students in the department to receive credit for the fourth semester of the requirement through advanced placement examinations in which a high proficiency in the knowledge and skills of an activity is demonstrated.

2. The Faculty Council at its meeting on November 21, 1966, approved the Proposed Revision of Class Attendance and Absences as presented on pages 3801-02 of the Documents and Proceedings of the Faculty Council except that in paragraph 2 of the revision, after the word "instructors," there is to be inserted the words "primarily for counseling purposes." The present rule indicates that regular attendance at all meetings of courses is expected, and implementation of this policy is the responsibility of the instructor, who may, however, have any special attendance requirements. The legislation set out in paragraph 2 provides that it is the duty of the instructor to keep a record of the attendance of freshmen and to report to the appropriate deans the names of freshmen who have acquired four absences and to report thereafter when the absences continue to be excessive. This change was proposed by the Student Academic Deans and has the approval of the Deans' Council.

3. The Faculty Council on December 13, 1966, approved by the circularization procedure the proposed changes in the College of Arts and Sciences (D&P 3811-13) as follows:

(1) Under "Requirements for the Degree of Bachelor of Arts, Plan I," under "Majors and Minors" the Departments of Botany, Microbiology, and Zoology recommend after Biology 607 the following insertion" (or such portion thereof as may be required by the score on the Biology placement test). " The same change is to be made under Requirements for the Degree of Bachelor of Arts, Plan II under "Order and Choice of Work." Under "Requirements for the Degree of Bachelor of Science in Architectural Studies," under "Prescribed Work," after biological sciences, insert "(if Biology 607 is offered, only such portion thereof need be taken as may be required by the score on the Biology placement test)." Similar changes are to be made under Requirements for the Degree of Bachelor of Science in Chemistry, for Bachelor of Science in Geology, Bachelor of Science in Medical Technology, and Bachelor of Science in Physics. The recommendation is made since the Departments now have, in addition to the college board placement test in biology, locally administered machine-graded advanced placement tests for both Biology 607a and Biology 607b. Those who pass their tests with scores between 90 and 100 are given college credit with a grade of A, and those with scores between 80 and 89, college credit with a grade of B. Those who make scores between 70 and 79 will be excused from the Biology 607 requirement but without grade or college credit. Students who pass the test only for Biology 607a or for 607b will be required to take the other half of the course.

(2) The Department of Germanic Languages, under Requirements for the Degree of Bachelor of Arts, Plan I, under "Majors and Minors" adds German 373, Representative Writers in order to increase diversity and substance in upper division offerings.

(3) The Department of Mathematics, under Requirements for the Degree of Bachelor of Arts, Plan I, under Major requirement, recommends that four semester hours of Mathematics 608E and six semester hours of Mathematics 808E be counted toward the major requirement since these hours are spent on calculus, whereas the remaining are spent on analytic geometry. These two courses presently appear in a listing of mathematics courses that may not be counted on the twenty-four semester hours required for the major.

(4) The Department of Sociology, under Requirements for the Degree of Bachelor of Arts, under Major requirement, recommends that Sociology 314 (Introduction to Social Research), or the equivalent, be added as a required course since undergraduate training in elementary research methods is now essential in the preparation of all sociology majors. This does not change the total required twenty-four hours of sociology.

ESTABLISHMENT OF AN AGENCY ACCOUNT: The University of Texas Press has requested the establishment of an Agency Account to handle transactions connected with publications for the Amon Carter Museum of Fort Worth. The Museum usually pays all cost of producing certain books with the University Press handling editorial and promotional details and charging the Amon Carter Museum account for the services. Sales of these books are through the University of Texas Press normal procedures, the net receipts from sales being divided 75% to Amon Carter Museum and 25% to the Press except in cases where the Press also contributes to the cost of manufacture. These transactions have been handled through the Piner Publications fund, but it is difficult to separate the two accounts. I therefore concur in the recommendation of Business Manager Colvin that such an account be established under agency funds, to be called "Amon Carter Museum - Contract Books."
