RENEWAL OF BLUE CROSS-BLUE SHIELD PLAN I CONTRACT

The anniversary date for renewal of the Blue Cross-Blue Shield contract for The University of Texas at Austin and The University of Texas System offices is December 1.

At the present time, Plan I is available to employees receiving \$400 or more per month, and Plan II which offers lesser benefits is available to those making less than \$400 per month. Since the University group is presently experience rated by combining both plans, and the rate increase per month for an individual now covered under Plan II would amount to 77¢ per month, and the rate increase for full family coverage for those now covered under Plan II would be only \$2.38 per month, we recommend that Plan II not be offered effective with the anniversary date of December 1.

I concur with the recommendation of System Personnel Adviser Kennedy and Vice-Chancellors Hackerman and Walker that Blue Cross-Blue Shield Plan I (including major medical) be the one plan available to all employees, without salary qualification, effective December 1, 1967.

2. Increase in Contingencies Allowance for Biological Sciences Building at The University of Texas at Austin

In order to provide more built-in Laboratory Equipment in the new Biological Sciences Building at The University of Texas at Austin, permission was obtained from the National Science Foundation to use all of the grant from that agency for construction, including that originally earmarked for General Purpose Laboratory Apparatus plus the University's matching funds for the laboratory apparatus. In order that this money will be available for change orders to the various contracts for the construction of this building to provide this additional build-in Laboratory Equipment and connections therefor, etc., it is recommended that the following transfers be approved, with authorization to the Director of the Office of Facilities Planning and Construction to issue change orders to the contracts involved not to exceed this amount:

5. Workmen's Compensation Insurance

It is recommended that the physician's fee for giving a Workmen's Compensation Insurance physical examination to a University employee be changed from \$5.00 to \$7.50 effective November 1, 1967.

The rate for the physical examination has been \$5.00 since November 1, 1959, when a change in rate was approved by the Board of Regents. During recent years, it has been increasingly difficult to find doctors who are willing to give a physical examination according to our standards for the \$5.00 fee. The Texas Highway Department and Texas A. & M. University have Workmen's Compensation Insurance programs similar to the one at The University of Texas, and all three State departments have been through the years paying essentially the same fee for their physical exams.

5. Workmen's Compensation Insurance (continued)

The Texas Highway Department increased their fee from \$5.00 to \$7.50 effective September 1, 1966. It was recently learned that Texas A. & M. University will increase their rate to \$7.50 effective September 1, 1967.

Based on 5,600 physicals, which it is estimated, will be given during the 1967-68 fiscal year, this proposed change in fee would mean a projected additional expenditure of \$12,500.00 during the ten months of the next fiscal year. It is also requested that an additional \$12,500.00 be transferred from Account Number 90-7801-A, Balance Forward, to 90-0200-0097, Physical Examinations, both in the budget of the System Personnel Office, Workmen's Compensation Insurance, to handle the increase in rate.

Dear Chancellor Ransom:

The following docket for The University of Texas at Austin is submitted for your approval and submission to the Board of Regents at its meeting in Austin on October 27 and 28, 1967.

RESEARCH AND OTHER ACADEMIC CONTRACTS: The following contracts grants and amendments have been signed by the appropriate official upon its recommendation of the respective technical directors, fiscal officers, and the Executive Director of the Office of Sponsored Projects.

Expenditures from these contracts and grants will be made in accordance with regular University operating procedures and contractual limitations. Personnel appointments and changes will be in accordance with University salary rates and approvals. Travel and purchasing will conform to established procedures.

I recommend your approval and ratification of signatures:

GOVERNMENT-SUPPORTED PROJECTS:

- 1. Modification No. 5, Supplemental Agreement to Contract AF 33(615)-1029, by which the Department of the Air Force, Air Force Systems Command, Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, Ohio, adds the sum of \$22,000 to the contract funds, making the total amount allotted \$238,193. The research on relativity and gravitational theories continues under the direction of Dr. Alfred Schild, Ashbel Smith Professor of Physics.
- 2. Modification No. 5, Change Order to Contract AF 33(615)-1971, by which the U. S. Air Force, Air Force Systems Command, Systems Engineering Group, Wright-Patterson AFB, Ohio, adds the sum of \$81,469 to the contract funds, and completes the funding of the contract to the present total cost level of \$862,012. The research continues in the Defense Research Laboratory under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr., Director.
- 3. Modification No. 7 to Contract AF 33(615)-2274, by which the United States Air Force, Air Force Systems Command, Systems Engineering Group, Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, Ohio, changes the accounting and appropriation data of the contract. The investigation of electromagnetic wave propagation in the millimeter spectrum from 100 Gc to 260 Gc continues in the Electrical Engineering Research Laboratory under the direction of Mr. C. W. Tolbert, Director of Millimeter Wave Sciences.
- 4. Modification No. 8, to Contract AF 33(615)-2274 by which the United States Air Force, Air Force Systems Command, Systems Engineering Group (ASD), Wright-Patterson, AFB, Ohio, provides additional Government property for use in the performance of the contract. The research continues in the Electrical Engineering Research Laboratory under the direction of C. W. Tolbert, Assistant Director.
- 5. Modification No. 5 to Contract AF 19(604)-5556, by which the Department of the Air Force. Electronic Systems Division, Air Force Systems Command, Laurence G. Hanscom Field, Bedford, Massachusetts, increases the estimated cost of the contract by \$10.45. The study of wind and temperature profiles in the atmosphere boundary layer was conducted in the Electrical Engineering Research Laboratory under the direction of Dr. A. W. Straiton, Ashbel Smith Professor of Electrical Engineering.

- 6. Modification No. P002 to Contract F33-657-67-C-0370, by which the U. S. Department of the Air Force, Air Force Systems Command, Aeronautical Systems Division, Wright-Patterson, AFB, Ohio, increases the cost of the contract by \$47,900 and extends the period of the contract through July 31, 1968. The research continues in the Defense Research Laboratory under the direction of Dr. C. M. McKinney, Jr., Director.
- 7. Contract DAAG17-67-C-0189, by which the Department of the Army, U. S. Army, Natick Laboratories, Natick, Massachusetts, provides the sum of \$61,819.52 for support of research entitled, "Research Study of Impulsive Loadings on Airdrop Structures." The contract is effective for the period August 1, 1967 through July 31, 1969, and the research will be performed under the direction of Dr. E. A. Ripperger, Professor of Engineering Mechanics.
- 8. Modification No. 4, Supplemental Agreement to Contract DA-49-092-ARO-87, by which the Department of the Army, Office of the Chief of Research and Development, Washington, D. C., extends the period of the contract through September 30, 1967. The research continues in the Electrical Engineering Research Laboratory under the direction of Dr. A. H. LaGrone, Professor of Electrical Engineering.
- 9. Modification No. 12 to Contract N60921-7233, by which the U. S. Naval Ordnance Laboratory, White Oak, Silver Spring, Maryland, extends the period of Task III through September 21, 1967. The research continues in the Defense Research Laboratory under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Director.
- 10. Modification No. 14 to Contract NObsr-93123, by which the Department of the Navy, Naval Ship Systems Command, Washington, D. C., increases the scope and the estimated cost of the contract by \$75,000,00 to a new total of \$1,254,586.00. Of the \$75,000.00, only \$58,150.00 is appropriated at this time. The research continues in the Defense Research Laboratory under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr., Director.
- 11. Modification No. 15, Contract No. NObsr-93123, by which the Department of the Navy, Naval Ship Systems Command, Washington, D. OFFICE OF EDUCATION, BUREAU OF HIGH EDUCATION, GRANTS FOR STUDENT PROGRAMS: The following allocations have been made to the University by the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare, the amount in each case being that requested by the University:

- 1) Educational Opportunity Grants Program: The authorized allocation to the University of Texas at Austin for the 1967-68 fiscal year under the Educational Opportunity Grants Program is \$342,000. These funds are to be expended at the first semester.
- 2) National Defense Student Loan Program: The sum of \$270,000 has been allocated to the University of Texas at Austin for the fiscal year 1967-68 for the National Defense Student Loan Program. This amount was determined by application of an allotment formula included in the Act, which is used whenever the total requests from institutions exceed the amount available for support of the Program. The total approved requests for 1967-68 exceeded the amount available by more than \$40 million. Allocations were also affected by the entrance of 87 new institutions into the Program.
- 3) United States Loan Program for Cuban Students: The University has been allocated the sum of \$11,500 under this program for the fall semester of the 1967-68 academic year. To be eligible for the program, the applicant must be an alien born in Cuba and unable to return, and a full-time student in good standing.

<u>FACULTY LEGISLATION:</u> I recommend approval of the following legislation passed by the Faculty Council and/or General Faculty:

1. The Faculty Council on August 28, 1967, approved by the circularization procedure the catalogue changes in the College of Fine Arts (D&P 3963-64). This legislation adds <u>Percussion</u> to the list of orchestral instruments for the four year curriculum given on page 29 of the 1965-67 Catalogue, and adds four percussion courses, 801, 810, 820, and 860, with descriptions thereof. The reason given for the changes is that "the better students tend to enroll in the universities which offer this type of program."
