

The following docket for the Main University is submitted for your approval and submission to the Board of Regents at its meeting in Austin on October 7 and 8, 1965:

RESEARCH AND OTHER ACADEMIC CONTRACTS: The following contracts, grants, and amendments have been signed by the appropriate official upon the recommendation of the respective technical directors, fiscal officers, and the Executive Director of the Office of Sponsored Projects.

Expenditures from these contracts and grants will be made in accordance with regular University operating procedures and contractual limitations. Personnel appointments and changes will be in accordance with University salary rates and approvals. Travel and purchasing will conform to established procedures.

I recommend your approval and ratification of signatures:

GOVERNMENT-SUPPORTED PROJECTS:

1. Modification No. 3, Supplemental Agreement to Contract AF 19(628)-4046, by which the Department of the Air Force, Electronics Systems Division, Air Force Systems Command, Laurence G. Hanscom Field, Bedford, Massachusetts, adds the sum of \$12,969.00 to the contract funds and increases the scope of the work. The electromagnetic investigations in the .001 cps to 5 cps region continue in the Electrical Engineering Research Laboratory under the direction of Dr. A.W. Straiton, Ashbel Smith Professor of Electrical Engineering.
2. Modification No. 2, Change Order to Contract AF 33(615)-1971, by which the Department of the Air Force, Systems Engineering Group, Research and Technology Division, Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, Ohio, adds the sum of \$158,936.00 to the contract funds. The research continues in the Defense Research Laboratory under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr.
3. Modification No. 5, Supplemental Agreement to Contract AF 33(657)-9587, by which the Department of the Air Force, Air Force Systems Command, Aeronautical Systems Division, Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, Ohio, extends the contract period through September 30, 1965. The research continues in the Defense Research Laboratory under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr.
4. Grant DA-ARO-D-31-124-G713, by which the Department of the Army, Army Research Office-Durham, (Durham) North Carolina, provides \$14,208.00 for support of research entitled " $\pi$  Electron Distribution and Substituent Effects in Aromatic Systems." The grant is effective for the period September 4, 1965 through September 3, 1966, and the research will be under the direction of Dr. M.J.S. Dewar, Robert A. Welch Professor of Chemistry.

5. Modification No. 1, Supplemental Agreement to Contract AT-(40-1)-3110, by which the United States Atomic Energy Commission, Oak Ridge, Tennessee, adds the sum of \$27,350.00 to the contract funds and extends the contract period through May 31, 1966. The investigations of the hybrid ion-electron cyclotron resonance of plasmas continues under the direction of Dr. Hans Schluter, Associate Professor of Physics.
6. Modification No. 3, Supplemental Agreement to Contract NObsr-93124, by which the Department of the Navy, Bureau of Ships, Washington, D.C., authorizes the disassembly of certain items of Government furnished equipment for incorporation into other equipment being assembled for use under this contract. The psychophysical studies relating to sonar continue in the Defense Research Laboratory under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr.
7. Contract OEO-508, by which the Office of Economic Opportunity, Washington, D.C., provides \$69,733.00 for support of research and submission of a report concerning variations among Project Headstart centers in Texas. The contract is effective for the period July 1, 1965 through September 30, 1966, and the research will be performed under the direction of Dr. John Pierce-Jones, Professor of Educational Psychology..
8. Contract OE-5-10-432, by which the United States Department of Health, Education, and Welfare, Office of Education, Washington, D.C., provides \$6,992.00 for support of a project to relate the control structure of the school system as perceived by elementary school principals and teachers in four types of school problems to the organizational climate of the school and to the teachers' beliefs about the extent they control aspects of their own behavior. The contract is effective for the period June 15, 1965 through May 31, 1966; however, costs incurred in performance of the contract from June 1, 1965 to June 15, 1965 are allowable to the same extent such costs would be if they had been incurred during the period of the contract. The project will be under the direction of Dr. Henry J. Otto, Professor of Educational Administration.
9. Contract OE-5-10-436, by which the United States Department of Health, Education, and Welfare, Office of Education, Washington, D.C., provides \$7,934.00 for research entitled "Effects of Demonstration Teaching upon Experienced and Inexperienced Teachers." The contract is effective for the period June 15, 1965 through May 31, 1966; however, costs incurred in performance of the contract from June 1, 1965 to June 15, 1965, are allowable to the same extent such costs would be allowable if they had been incurred during the period of the contract. The contract will be under the direction of Dr. Ben M. Harris, Associate Professor of Educational Administration.
10. Supplemental Stipend Certification to Contract OE 5-48-017, by which the United States Department of Health, Education, and Welfare, Office of Education, Washington, D.C., adds the sum of \$480.00 to the contract funds for four additional dependents. The Summer Institute for 40 Educational Media Specialists continues under the direction of Dr. William G. Wolfe, Professor of Educational Psychology.
11. Contract OE-6-10-047, by which the United States Department of Health, Education, and Welfare, Office of Education, Washington, D.C., provides \$3,994.00 for support of research entitled "The Role of Spatial Abilities in the Performance of Certain Motor Skills." The contract is effective for the period July 1, 1965 through December 31, 1965, and the research will be performed under the direction of Dr. Lynn W. McCraw, Professor of Physical and Health Education.

Grant AM 08890-02, by which the United States Department of Health, Education, and Welfare, Public Health Service, provides \$24,572.00 for support of research entitled "Plasma Amino Acid Studies." 4. Memorandum of Agreement with Cotton Research Committee of Texas, signed by Budget Officer Frank D. Graydon for Chancellor Harry Ransom, which provides for research, including surveys and other investigations relating to the marketing of cotton fiber, cottonseed, and cottonseed products. The period of the agreement is September 1, 1965, through August 31, 1966.
5. Interagency Contract No. 4413-1147 with Texas Technological College, signed by Business Manager James H. Colvin, whereby the University through its Radiocarbon Dating Laboratory will furnish necessary services to determine for Texas Technological College the radiocarbon ages of certain samples of carbonate rock and organic fractions of sediments, the University to be reimbursed for each rock sample examined which does not require special pretreatment in the amount of \$30.00, and in the amount of \$30.00 plus cost of extra time and chemicals for those needing pretreatment. The period of the agreement is August 3 - 31, 1965, and the total cost is not to exceed \$770.00.
6. Interagency Contract No. 4413-1148 with the Panhandle-Plains Historical Museum of Canyon, Texas, signed by Business Manager James H. Colvin, whereby the University through its Radiocarbon Dating Laboratory will furnish necessary services to determine radiocarbon ages of certain standard charcoal samples, for which the University will receive \$30.00 for each sample examined, including cost of chemicals used in preparation thereof. The period of the contract is August 5 - 31, 1965, and total payment is not to exceed \$300.00.
7. Interagency Contract No. 4413-1149 with Texas A & M University, signed by Business Manager James H. Colvin, which provides for the producing and videotaping of six Biology demonstrations by the University's Radio-Television during the period July 12 - August 31, 1965, the University to be reimbursed in an amount not to exceed \$2,749.58 for this service.
8. Contract No. PC-73-1021 with the Peace Corps, signed by Business Manager James H. Colvin, whereby the University will provide a training program during the period June 18 to September 10, 1965, for approximately 90 Peace Corps Volunteers who will be engaged in the teaching of English as a Second Language in Afghanistan. The amount of the contract is \$70,616 and the program will be under the direction of Dr. Joe Neal, Director, International Office.

BUSINESS CONTRACT: Business Manager James H. Colvin has signed a contract for student laundry and dry cleaning in Kinsolving Dormitory with Austin Laundry and Dry Cleaning Company, Inc., and Burtons Laundry and Cleaners. The period of the contract is September 6, 1965, through May 31, 1966, and is subject to the same conditions and requirements as in the previous year. The University will be paid \$25.00 per month for rental of room 53 from which the receiving and delivery of laundry and cleaning will be handled.

OUTSIDE EMPLOYMENT: I recommend that the persons listed below be permitted to undertake the outside duties specified for each, the work to be arranged so as not to interfere with University assignments and otherwise to conform to Chapter III, Sec. 13, of Part One of the Rules and Regulations of the Board of Regents for the Government of The University of Texas:

1. Mr. F. Ray Marshall, Professor of Economics, to act as impartial arbitrator for the Federal Mediation & Conciliation Service, The American Arbitration Association, and various companies and unions; and as consultant to the American Institute for Free Labor Development on a special project on training Latin American labor economists.

4. A Pictorial Approach to Perspective, Shades and Shadows, by J. R. Holmes and N. C. McGuire, both Associate Professors of Drawing, published by the University Co-Operative Society of Austin, which sells for \$4.50 with a 10% royalty to authors.

5. Perspective, Shades and Shadows, Series A, by J. R. Holmes, Associate Professor of Drawing, published by the Co-Operative Society of Austin, which sells for \$1.00 with no royalty to author.

6. Technical Lettering Exercises, by J. R. Holmes, Associate Professor of Drawing, published by the University Co-Operative Society of Austin, which sells for \$0.30 with 10% royalty to author.

TRAVEL PAID FROM NON-TRAVEL FUNDS: The following travel expenses have been paid from funds not specifically allocated for travel:

1. Mr. Forest G. Hill, Professor of Economics, September 1 - 3, 1965, to New Haven, Connecticut, to attend the Economic History Association meetings, where he will make an annual report to the Board of Trustees as the Chairman of its Membership Committee, and to meet with the Council on Research in Economic History, expenses to be paid from Miscellaneous Administrative Expenses, Office of the Vice-Chancellor for Academic Affairs.
2. Mr. Robert Shobbrook, McDonald Post-Graduate Fellow, Research in Astronomy, July 22 - August 7, 1965, to McDonald Observatory at Fort Davis, Texas, to observe during regularly scheduled observing run, a small portion of his expenses to be paid from the Maintenance and Operation account of Research in Astronomy.
3. Mr. Charles L. Seeger, Special Research Associate, Research in Astronomy, June 16 - 26, 1965, to New Haven, Connecticut, to discuss NASA Space Radio Astronomy proposal; to Washington, D. C., for meeting with National Academy of Science; to Chicago, Illinois, and Tucson, Arizona, to discuss 82-inch telescope revisions; and July 18 - 29, 1965, to McDonald Observatory, to observe, a small portion of his expenses for both trips to be paid from the Maintenance and Operation account of Research in Astronomy.
4. Mr. Edwin T. Bowden, Associate Professor of English, September 1 - 10, 1965, to New York City, to do some bibliographical research; expenses to be paid from University Research Institute grant.

AFFILIATE PROFESSORSHIP: The National Center for Atmospheric Research, Boulder, Colorado, has worked out an "affiliate professorship" plan whereby its scientific staff may establish long-term ties with universities in cases where this would be of mutual benefit. Under this arrangement Dr. Bernhard Haurwitz will be assigned to the University of Texas as Professor of Atmospheric Sciences for a three-year period beginning September 1, 1965. At NCAR expense, Dr. Haurwitz may spend up to a total of six weeks and up to two visits on the University campus in each full year of his appointment. He will spend at least one, but not more than three, academic semesters during the three-year period in residence, during which time the University will pay half of his salary, the other half being paid by NCAR for the research he will do. Dr. Haurwitz is one of the two or three senior scientists in the NCAR Advanced Studies Program, a capable and mature scientist of international reputation, with a specialty in upper atmosphere physics and dynamics. He was departmental chairman for Meteorology and Oceanography at New York University, and later at the University of Colorado. He resigned from the latter university in 1964 to accept his present position with NCAR.

ESTABLISHMENT OF AGENCY ACCOUNT: The University of Texas Press has entered into a publishing relationship with the American Folklore Society whereby the Press will issue all their books, collect dues and subscriptions, collect payments for their books, and pay printing, mailing, and other related costs. To accomplish this, an agency account has been established on the University's books entitled University Press - American Folklore Society Account.

RECOMMENDED AMENDMENTS TO THE 1964-65 BUDGET



BUSINESS CONTRACT ITEMS





6. Pharmacology Laboratory Manual, written by Drs. James G. Hilton, Rene R. Kempen, Glenn F. Kiplinger, Joe B. Nash, printed at the Medical Branch Print Shop, sells for \$1.00 without royalty to the authors.
7. Techniques Manual, written by members of the Department of Physiology, printed by the Medical Branch Print Shop, sells for \$3.50 without royalty to the authors.
8. Radiology of the Heart and Great Vessels, written by Robert N. Cooley, M. D., Professor and Chairman of the Department of Radiology, and Robert D. Sloan, M. 
