At the Regents' Meeting held December 7, 1967, a contract was awarded to Vowell Construction Company, El Paso, Texas, for the installation of a large drain pipe in the arroyo south of the Physical Science Building at The University of Texas at El Paso. The approved level of lending was put at \$426.000.

EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITY GRANT: The total of \$230,460 allocated for the period July 1, 1968 - June 30, 1969, has been adjusted by increasing by \$31,200 the initial year allocation, bringing it to a new level of \$120,950, and decreasing the renewal year allocation by \$36,610, the additional \$5,410 being released from University use, and bringing the total award for the period to \$225,050. This adjustment was made on recommendation of the Office of Student Financial Aids based upon what the needs were found to be.
