### OTHER MATTERS

As a result of the accreditation process with the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS), the U.T. Brownsville/Texas Southmost College Partnership Advisory Committee has concurred in the following clarification Resolution related to the Educational Partnership Agreement which was adopted by the respective governing boards and approved by the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board.

### RESOLUTION

In December 1995, the Commission on Colleges of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS) transferred the accreditation of both Texas Southmost College and U. T. Brownsville (the accredited institutions) to the U. T. Brownsville/Texas Southmost Partnership as a consolidated and single operating entity.

In gaining accredited status for the partnership it was necessary to clarify the meaning of several terms used in the Educational Partnership Agreement and other partnership documents. These meanings as described below have been previously shared with circulation of accreditation materials and are concurred in by the Partnership Advisory Committee and recommended to the respective Boards for ratification with the additional recommendation that the President and Executive Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs be authorized to incorporate these clarifications, as editorial corrections, into a revised Partnership Agreement.

Clarifications to the operating parameters of the partnership resulting from December 1995 action by Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS) are as follows:

1. Reference to The University of Texas Brownsville as the "operating entity" is a reference to The University of Texas at Brownsville/Texas Southmost College educational partnership as accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools.

2. Reference to "TSC" as an oversight entity means the Southmost Union Junior College District Board of Trustees, also referred to as the Southmost Board.

3. Reference to "TSC programs" means lower division, occupational/technical and other community college programs.

4. Reference to "UTB programs" means, as appropriate within the context of the reference, either upper division and graduate level programs or all programs offered by the educational partnership.

5. Reference to the "Partnership Governing Board" means The University of Texas System Board of Regents, also referred to as the U. T. Board of Regents.

6. The parties acknowledge as part of accreditation documentation that since September 1, 1992, TSC exists as a set of programs and activities delivered by the partnership under contract with Southmost Union Junior College District.
