1. Change the appointment of Mr. F. L. Cox, Assistant to the President; Legal Adviser on Residence Matters from two-thirds to full time for the period February 1-June 15, 1957, the \$1,350 (representing teaching salary stipend for the Second Semester) to come from Central Administration - Unallocated funds.
2. Terminate the appointment of Miss Thelma Lockwood, Reports and Information Analyst at \$6,168 for twelve months, effective at close of business January 31, 1957, since she has been approved to work in the Endowment Office.

TRANSFER OF UNENCUMBERED GENERAL REVENUE FUND APPROPRIATIONS: Mr. G. C. Starnes, Auditor, has advised that there will be some excess General Revenue Funds available in Appropriation Number W-981 - All Other General Administration Salaries, and requests approval of the following transfer authorization in order that such funds may be advantageously used during the remaining portion of the current fiscal year:

Pursuant to the provisions of Article V, Section 18, Sub-section j, House Bill 140, 54th Legislature, Regular Session, it is hereby resolved that the State Comptroller be requested to make the following transfers between the Legislative Appropriations from the General Revenue Fund for Central Administration for the Fiscal Year 1956-57:

Transfer the free and unencumbered balance in Appropriation Number W-981 - All Other General Administration Salaries to Appropriation for General Operating Expenses (Appropriation Number to be supplied).

I recommend approval.

ACTUARIAL FEES FOR SPECIAL RETIREMENT PROGRAM: S.C.R. No. 78, Fifty-fourth Legislature, directs the Governing Boards of the State-supported institutions of higher education, with the Texas Commission on Higher Education, to study ". . . the feasibility of establishing, within the framework of the teacher retirement program of the State, a special retirement program designed to meet the special needs of personnel in the State-supported institutions of higher education . . ." and further states "that each institution of higher education is hereby authorized to pay its proportionate cost of this study as determined by the governing boards from the item 'General Operating Expenses' in H. B. 140."



The Special Committee of the Governing Boards of the State-supported institutions and the Texas Commission on Higher Education have selected Huggins & Company, Consulting Actuaries, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, to make the necessary actuarial study, at an agreed initial cost not to exceed \$4,500. If further studies are required, Huggins & Company will make charges for such additional services in accordance with their usual scale, rendering the bill upon completion of the study. I recommend that approval be given our component units to pay their pro-rata share (to be fixed on the basis of the number of employees). Of the \$4,500 initial cost the amounts are estimated as follows:

I am submitting herewith a docket for the Main University, Organized Research, and Extension Division for the meeting of the Board of Regents on February 9, 1957.

1956-57 Budget

CONTRACTS: The following contracts have been executed at the Main University by the official indicated. I recommend approval and ratification of signatures:

1. Contract No. 33(608)-57-52 with Air Force Institute of Technology, Wright Patterson Air Force Base, Ohio, signed on behalf of the University by Vice-President C. P. Boner, whereby The Hogg Foundation for Mental Hygiene will furnish during November 13-December 7, 1956, a Marriage and Family Counseling Seminar for thirty (30) Air Force Chaplains in Austin, Texas. The total amount of the contract is \$3,487.38.
2. Contract No. 33(608)-57-64 with Air Force Institute of Technology, Wright Patterson Air Force Base, Ohio, signed on behalf of the University by Vice-President C. P. Boner, whereby The Hogg Foundation for Mental Hygiene will furnish during January 7-February 1, 1957, a Marriage and Family Counseling Seminar for thirty (30) Air Force Chaplains in Austin, Texas. The total amount of the contract is \$3,487.37.
3. Contract N600(P) 43499 with Navy Purchasing Office, Department of the Navy, Washington, D. C., signed on behalf of the University by Vice-President C. P. Boner, dated September 5, 1956, and extending until June 30, 1957, the estimated total contract price being \$10,000. The contract provides for educational instruction and such other services and materials as may be necessary for any semester, period or session (1) to carry out the Regulations for the Administration and Training, Naval Reserve Officers' Training Corps, and/or (2) to train commissioned officers of the regular Navy entitled to training under the so-called "FIVE-TERM Program."
4. Contract No. AT-(40-1)-GEN-33 with the Oak Ridge Institute of Nuclear Studies, signed on behalf of the University by Vice-President C. P. Boner, whereby the University will sponsor the showing of a traveling exhibit in the field of atomic energy, which the Institute has contracted with the United States Government to provide to promote public interest and education in this field. The exhibit will be in the State between the dates of January 21 and March 9, 1957. Associate Dean Norris Hiatt of the Division of Extension will handle the project for the University.

OUTSIDE AND ADDITIONAL DUTIES: I recommend that the staff members listed be given permission to undertake the outside and additional duties indicated, the work to be so arranged as not to interfere with University assignments:

1. Mr. Samuel P. Ellison, Jr., Professor of Geology, to act as consulting geologist to Mr. John A. Jackson, Dallas, December 24, 26-31, 1956, and January 2, 23-27, 1957, at a stipend of \$100 per day.
2. Mr. Edward C. Jonas, Assistant Professor of Geology, to act as a consultant to the Minerals and Chemicals Corporation of America of Menlo Park, New Jersey, the time not to exceed four days in any one month and compensation to be \$50.00 per day.
3. Mr. Raymond F. Dawson, Associate Director, Bureau of Engineering Research, to continue to act as consultant to Shell Oil Company.
4. Mr. John A. Focht, Assistant Dean, College of Engineering, to do consulting for Mr. Claude Gilmer of Rock Springs, Texas, in connection with a traffic accident case. The fee will be \$100 a day.
5. Miss Phyllis Young, Guest Lecturer, Department of Music, to serve as cello consultant for the Fifth Annual Midwestern University String Clinic in Wichita Falls, travel expenses to be paid in the amount of \$50.00.

These recommendations were approved by the College of Arts and Sciences at its meeting on November 20, 1956. The Secretary has classified these recommendations of exclusive application and primary interest only to a single school or college.

Notice is hereby given that this legislation will be presented to the Board of Regents for adoption unless a signed protest, with reasons, is received by the Secretary of the Faculty Council from a member of the Council within five days of the date of this publication. If a protest is received, the proposed legislation will be presented to the Faculty Council for action at its meeting of December 17, 1956.

RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE COLLEGE OF ARTS AND SCIENCES

On pages 48-49 of the Catalogue of the College of Arts and Sciences for 1955-57 under the "Requirements for the Degree of Bachelor of Science in Chemistry," under "A. Prescribed Work,"

1. CHANGE requirement 1

From: "Twelve semester hours of English (English 601 or 601Q, and six semester hours of sophomore English)."

To: "Six semester hours of English including English 317Q, exclusive of credit obtained by Advanced Standing Examination."

Reason: The Department of Chemistry believes that the amount specified is adequate and that any additional work in this area desired by the student could be taken on an elective basis. The effect of the change is to liberalize the requirements by giving more elective hours.

2. CHANGE requirement 3

From: "French 406, 407, and 314K, or Russian 406, 407, and 612a; and German 406, 407, and 314K or 315K (or such portion thereof as may be required by the scores on the placement tests)."

To: "German 406, 407, and 314K or 315K (or such portion thereof as may be required by the score on the placement test). If a second language is desired, French or Russian is recommended."

Reason: This will bring the B.S. language requirement in line with the B.A. The Department of Chemistry believes that the amount specified is adequate and any additional work in this area desired by the student can be taken on an elective basis. The effect of the change is to liberalize the requirements by giving more elective hours.

3. CHANGE requirement 4

From: "Physics 801, or 401 and 812."

To: "Either Physics 401 and 812, or Physics 801 and 812b, with the former preferred."

Reason: The Department of Chemistry believes this change is highly desirable for chemistry majors in the light of present-day developments.

4. CHANGE requirement 7

From: "Six semester hours in biological science, including laboratory work."

To: "Six semester hours in laboratory courses in either bacteriology, biology, botany, geology, or zoology."

Reason: To give the students an adequate knowledge of the courses available to them.

5. CHANGE requirement 8

From: "Forty to forty-two semester hours of chemistry, including at least six semester hours in each of the following: (a) general inorganic chemistry, including qualitative analysis; (b) quantitative analytical chemistry; (c) organic chemistry; (d) physical chemistry; and (e) six additional semester hours of senior courses in chemistry. Each of these fundamental courses (a, b, c, and d) must include laboratory work."

To: "Not less than forty-one semester hours of chemistry including at least six semester hours in each of the following: (a) general chemistry, including qualitative analysis; (b) quantitative analytical chemistry; (c) organic chemistry; (d) physical chemistry; (e) nine additional semester hours of course work in chemistry, at least six of which must be at the senior level. Each of the fundamental courses (a, b, c, and d) must include laboratory work."

Reason: The Department of Chemistry believes this is a more precise statement of the needs in chemistry for students majoring in chemistry.

6. CHANGE requirement 11

From: "Enough additional work to make a total of 132 semester hours."

To: "Enough additional work to make a total of 132 semester hours, including three semester hours chosen from either (1) the area of the social sciences: government, history, anthropology (except physical anthropology), classical civilization (except literature in translation), economics, geography (except physical geography), Philosophy (except logic and aesthetics), psychology (except experimental psychology), sociology, or (2) the area of arts and literature: aesthetics, architecture, art, drama, music, literature courses above freshman level in English or in another language, courses above freshman level in composition, creative writing, linguistics, speech, technical writing."

Reason: In order to meet the minimum general education requirements for undergraduate degrees.
