

The following docket for the Main University is submitted for your approval and submission to the Board of Regents at its meeting in Galveston on March 10 and 11, 1967.

RESEARCH AND OTHER ACADEMIC CONTRACTS: The following contracts, grants and amendments have been signed by the appropriate official upon the recommendation of the respective technical directors, fiscal officers, and the Executive Director of the Office of Sponsored Projects.

Expenditures from these contracts and grants will be made in accordance with regular University operating procedures and contractual limitations. Personnel appointments and changes will be in accordance with University salary rates and approvals. Travel and purchasing will conform to established procedures.

I recommend your approval and ratification of signatures:

GOVERNMENT-SUPPORTED PROJECTS:

1. Modification No. 2, Supplemental Agreement to Contract AF 30(602)-4070, by which the Department of the Air Force, Headquarters, Rome Air Development Center, Griffiss Air Force Base, New York, furnishes to the Contractor one (1) Modified Sinewriter (Chicoder) for use in the performance of the contract. The research in Chinese Lexicography continues under the direction of Dr. W. P. Lehmann, Ashbel Smith Professor of Germanic Languages and Linguistics.
2. Modification No. 2, Supplemental Agreement to Contract AF 30(602)-4246, by which the Department of the Air Force, Rome Air Development Center, Griffiss Air Force Base, New York, adds the sum of \$49,997.00 to the contract funds for a subcontract to Georgetown University, Washington, D. C. The research in Russian-English machine translation on a syntactic level continues at the Linguistics Research Center under the direction of Dr. W. P. Lehmann, Ashbel Smith Professor of Germanic Languages and Linguistics.
3. Modification No. 5, Supplemental Agreement to Contract AF 49(638)-1115, by which the Department of the Air Force, Air Force Office of Scientific Research, Arlington, Virginia, transfers title to The University of Texas of certain items of Government-owned equipment. The investigation of the buried crust of the North American continent continues under the direction of Dr. William R. Muehlberger, Professor of Geology.
4. Grant AF-AFOSR-273-67, by which the Department of the Air Force, Air Force Office of Scientific Research, Arlington, Virginia, provides the sum of \$35,000.00 for support of research entitled "Physics of Metastable Systems." The grant is effective for the period February 1, 1967 through January 31, 1968, and the research will be performed under the direction of Dr. W. W. Robertson, Professor of Physics.
5. Grant AF-AFOSR-1257-67, by which the Department of the Air Force, Air Force Office of Scientific Research, Arlington, Virginia, provides \$115,886.00 for support of research entitled "Calculations of Dynamical Properties of Solids." The grant is effective for the period February 1, 1967 through January 31, 1970, and the research will be performed under the direction of Dr. F. W. de Wette, Professor of Physics.
6. Modification No. 4, Supplemental Agreement to Contract AF 33(657)-7482, by which the Department of the Air Force, Systems Engineering Group, Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, Ohio, adds the sum of \$343.93 to the contract funds. The research on general relativity and other gravitational theories was conducted under the direction of Dr. Alfred Schild, Ashbel Smith Professor of Physics.

Stratton, Ashbel Smith Professor of Electrical Engineering.
8. Contract F33608-67-C-0175, by which the Department of the Air Force, Air Force Institute of Technology, Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, Ohio, provides \$11,894.00 for support of two graduate seminars on "Counseling in Human Factors" during the periods January 8, 1967 through February 2, 1967 and April 30, 1967 through May 25, 1967. The seminars will be conducted under the direction of Dr. Robert L. Sutherland, Hogg Professor of Sociology.
9. Modification M01, Change Order to Contract F33608-67-C-0175, by which the Department of the Air Force, Air Force Institute of Technology, Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, Ohio, deletes the Patent Indemnity Clause and corrects the clause pertaining to determination of costs under the contract. The project continues under the direction of Dr. Robert L. Sutherland, Hogg Professor of Sociology.
10. Modification No. 4, Supplemental Agreement to Contract DA-44-177-AMC-200(T), by which the Department of the Army, Headquarters, U. S. Army Aviation Materiel Laboratories, Fort Eustis, Virginia, establishes a final overhead rate of 38.7% of salaries and wages for the period June 30, 1964 through August 31, 1964. The research on the analysis, design and fabrication, and testing of a modern airfoil section utilizing jet edges of the airfoil was directed by Dr. S. W. Yuan, Professor of Aerospace Engineering.
11. Contract DAAB07-67-C-0180, by which the Department of the Army, U. S. Army Electronics Command, Ft. Monmouth, New Jersey, provides \$87,838.00 for support of research entitled "Advance Optical Jamming System." The contract is effective for the period January 1, 1967 through December 31, 1967, and the research will be performed in the Electrical Engineering Research Laboratory under the direction of Dr. Alfred H. LaGrone, Professor of Electrical Engineering.
12. Change "B" to Contract NBy-63876, by which the Department of the Navy, Naval Facilities Engineering Command, Washington, D. C., adds the sum of \$16,000.00 to the contract funds and extends the contract period to March 31, 1968. The study of computer solutions of long reinforced concrete columns in frames continues under the direction of Phil M. Ferguson, Professor of Civil Engineering.
13. Modification No. 11, Supplemental Agreement to Contract NObsr-93125, by which the Department of the Navy, Naval Ship Systems Command, Washington, D. C., incorporates in the contract certain details of the proposed technical program and authorizes the purchase of an optimum farfield calibration system. The sonar transducer evaluation study continues in the Defense Research Laboratory under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr.
14. Modification No. 12, Supplemental Agreement to Contract NObsr-93125, by which the Department of the Navy, Naval Ship Systems Command, Washington, D. Under the terms of the Department of Defense Industrial Security Manual for Safeguarding Classified Information, which is applicable to these contracts, the contractor (University) may not retain classified material beyond the time required by the "Records" clause of the contract unless such retention is approved by the Contracting Officer. Under the contract "Records" clause, the University is required to maintain its fiscal and related contract records for a period of three years after final payment under the contract. Thereafter, the government is precluded from further audit. The University's request to retain for official records one fully executed copy of each of these contracts beyond the requirement of the "Records" clause was denied. Therefore, we will have to delete those classified sections of the contracts which primarily describe the technical work that was performed under the contracts. The University Auditor advises that full payment has been made under the contracts, that the "Records" clause of the contracts has been satisfied and that he has no objection to the deletion of the classified portions of these contracts. I recommend that the Board of Regents authorize the deletion of the classified portions of the above contracts.

FACULTY LEGISLATION: I recommend approval of the following legislation passed by the Faculty Council and/or General Faculty:

1. The Faculty Council at its meeting of December 12, 1966, approved the calendar for the 1968 Summer Session (D&P 3814) as presented by the Course Committee, and for the 1968-69 Long Session the Calendar presented by the Committee (D&P 3815-16) with amendments.

The Summer Session calendar provides for registration on Tuesday and Wednesday, June 4 and 5, with classes beginning June 6 for the First Term. Examinations for the First Term are scheduled for July 13-16, and no classes are scheduled on these days for the nine-week and twelve-week courses. July 4 and 5 are holidays. The Second Term begins July 17 with registration and with classes beginning on July 18, and final examinations August 24-27. August 27 is designated graduation day but without public exercises.

The amended 1968-69 Long Session calendar provides for registration September 16-20; November 28-30, Thanksgiving holidays; December 23-January 4, Christmas vacation, with classes resuming Monday, January 6. No classes are scheduled for January 13-15, and examinations will begin January 16, ending January 25, with that day designated graduation day, but no public exercises. The Second Semester begins January 27 with registration through January 31. March 31-April 5 is spring vacation; May 16-17, no-class days, (except in School of Law) with final examinations scheduled for May 19-28. Commencement Day is May 31, 1969.

2. The Faculty Council on January 25, 1967, approved by the circularization procedure the proposed changes in the Bachelor of Science in Radio-Television-Film Degree and in the Bachelor of Journalism Degree (D&P 3837-39). This legislation rearranges Journalism courses in Plan I, News Studies, and in Plan II, Advertising, since there has been a revision of journalism course offerings. These changes reflect an adaptation of the degree requirements to these course changes but do not increase the 30 semester hours required in the major nor the total 120 semester hours required for the degree.

The Radio-Television-Film legislation adds Communication 301 as a required course for the major in addition to the thirty semester hours previously required, this to adjust to revision of courses offered by the Department. The minor requirements are changed by not specifying courses, thus simplifying the choice of a minor among many valuable fields of study.

3. The Faculty Council on January 30, 1967, approved by the circularization procedure the catalogue changes in the School of Law (D&P 3840). This legislation deals in part with admission to the program leading to the degree of Master of Comparative Jurisprudence of graduates of foreign law schools whose training has been primarily in a system of law other than the Anglo-American legal system. This tailors the standard of performance to the needs and interests of the individual concerned, and the responsibility for admission is the dean's and not a faculty committee's.

This legislation also deals with changes in procedures for freshman admission by moving back the date of completing application for the September class to May 1 instead of July 15. This allows those students who are not accepted for the University of Texas Law School for the fall an opportunity to try the school of their second choice.

4. On February 6, 1967, the Faculty Council approved by the circularization procedure catalogue changes in the College of Arts and Sciences (D&P 3852-53).

Part of this legislation restates, without altering total number of semester hours required, the major requirements for the Degree of Bachelor of Arts, Plan I, Biology, the essential change being that one Zoology course is no longer offered and a course in genetics is substituted.

Another part of the legislation deals with the requirements for the Degree of Bachelor of Arts, Plan I, under majors and minors in Philosophy. The total number of hours is not changed but three more of the major hours must be advanced. The first minor has been changed so as not to be restricted to social sciences and fine arts since the department feels that students may well minor in mathematics, English, physics, or with the consent of the undergraduate adviser and approval of the dean, in still other subjects.

The third change in the catalogue deals with the major requirement in Russian. This increases the number of hours required for the major to thirty-four (from thirty-two) by adding Russian 218, a new course entitled "Intensive Practice in Spoken Russian." The department feels that with so little local opportunity to speak Russian, this course is necessary to provide extra time for proper practice in pronunciation and conversation. The legislation also increases by three the number of advanced hours needed for the major.

OUTSIDE EMPLOYMENT: I recommend that the persons listed below be permitted to undertake the outside duties specified for each, the work to be arranged so as not to interfere with University assignments and otherwise to conform to Chapter III, Sec. 13, of Part I of the Rules and Regulations of the Board of Regents for the Government of The University of Texas:

1. Mr. Norman Hackerman, Vice-Chancellor for Academic Affairs, to serve on the Oak Ridge National Laboratory Advisory Committee for Reactor Chemistry.
2. Mr. Willis W. Pratt, Professor of English, to teach an advanced English course at Trinity University, which will require his presence in San Antonio for three hours one evening a week, January to June, 1967.
3. Miss Phyllis Richards, Professor of Home Economics, to serve as consultant for Headstart and Community Action Programs for LSI Service Corporation for Office of Economic Opportunity, Washington, D. C.
4. Mr. Frank W. Elliott, Jr., Professor of Law, to prepare a legal memorandum for a Fort Worth attorney.

5. Mr. Keith E. Morrison, Professor of Law, to prepare for a Dallas attorney a legal memorandum on the tax consequences to the lender of an equipment lease for a substantial period of time.
6. Mr. Millard H. Ruud, Professor of Law, to review some proposed legislation in the local government law area from a technical and policy point of view for Texas Research League.
7. Mr. M. K. Woodward, Professor of Law, to prepare wills for a couple.
8. Mr. Wallace L. Guess, Associate Professor of Pharmacy, to act as consultant on toxicology of plastics used in medical practice for Melpar, Inc., Falls Church, Virginia.

ESTABLISHMENT OF THE BURDINE CLAYTON ANDERSON SCHOLARSHIP IN MUSIC:

Mr. and Mrs. Thomas D. Anderson of Houston have given \$10,000 to establish the Burdine Clayton Anderson Scholarship in Music in memory of Mr. Anderson's mother. The terms of the gift specifies that the revenues from the principal are to be earmarked to pay the tuition of a worthy student majoring in music. I recommend acceptance of this scholarship.


