Dear Chancellor Ransom:

The following docket for the Main University is submitted for your approval and submission to the Board of Regents at its meeting in Austin on April 1 and 2, 1966.

RESEARCH AND OTHER ACADEMIC CONTRACTS: The following contracts, grants, and amendments have been signed by the appropriate official upon the recommendation of the respective technical directors, fiscal officers, and the Executive Director of the Office of Sponsored Projects.

Expenditures from these contracts and grants will be made in accordance with regular University operating procedures and contractual limitations. Personnel appointments and changes will be in accordance with University salary rates and approvals. Travel and purchasing will conform to established procedures.

I recommend your approval and ratification of signatures:

GOVERNMENT-SUPPORTED PROJECTS:

- 1. Modification No. 7, Change Order to Contract DA 18064-AMC-118(A), by which the Department of the Army, United States Army Biological Laboratories, Fort Detrick, Frederick, Maryland, changes the accounting and appropriation data effective January 1, 1966. The study of the requirements for the production of interferons from a genetic point of view was conducted under the direction of Dr. Royce Z. Lockart, Associate Professor of Microbiology.
- 2. Modification No. 2, Supplemental Agreement to Contract DA19-129-AMC-2096, by which the Department of the Army, United States Army Natick Laboratories, Natick, Massachusetts, establishes a fixed overhead rate of 38.7% of salaries and wages for the period October 1, 1962 through September 30, 1964. The research on ground impact shock mitigation continues in the Structural Mechanics Research Laboratory under the direction of J. Neils Thompson, Professor of Civil Engineering.
- 3. The optical jamming system study continues in the Electrical Engineering Research Laboratory under the direction of Dr. A.H. LaGrone, Professor of Electrical Engineering.
- 9. Modification No. 25, Supplemental Agreement to Contract N60921-7002, by which the Department of the Navy, United States Naval Ordnance Laboratory, White Oak, Silver Spring, Maryland, extends Task II of the contract through April 30, 1966. The research continues in the Defense Research Laboratory under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr.
- 10. Modification No. 1, Change Order to Contract N60921-7233, by which the Department of the Navy, United States Naval Ordnance Laboratory, White Oak, Silver Spring, Maryland, approves reimbursement for actual expenses of car rental when required, provides reimbursement at actual cost for outbound shipping charges, and transfers all classified material generated or received under predecessor contracts to this contract. The research continues in the Defense Research Laboratory under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr.
- 11. Mcdification No. 4, Supplemental Agreement to Contract N123(62738)52022A(X), by which the Department of the Navy, United States Navy Purchasing Office, Los Angeles, California, extends the period of the contract through January 31, 1966, and increases the estimated cost of the contract by \$6,855.00 from \$101,930.00 to \$108,785.00. The evaluation of the capabilities of a government-furnished AN/DPN-21 Seeker continues in the Defense Research Laboratory under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr.

- 12. Modification No. 4, Supplemental Agreement to Contract NObsr-93123, by which the Department of the Navy, Bureau of Ships, Washington, D.C., adds the sum of \$95,000.00 to the contract funds and extends the period of the contract through December 31, 1966. The soner studies continue in the Defense Research Laboratory under the direction of Dr. Chester M. McKinney, Jr.
- 13. - 15. The studies relating to the subsurface resistivity of the earth by the use of earth current and magnetic field measurements continue in the Electrical Engineering Research Laboratory under the direction of Dr. H.W. Smith, Professor of Electrical Engineering.

- 12. Grant F-126, by which The Robert A. Welch Foundation, Houston, Texas, provides \$150,000.00 for support of research entitled "Relationship Between Chemical Behavior and Molecular Structure." The grant is effective for the period May 1, 1966 through April 30, 1969, and the research will be performed under the direction of Dr. Michael J.S. Dewar, Robert A. Welch Professor of Chemistry.

ACADEMIC CONTRACTS. The following contracts have been executed at the Main University by the official indicated. I recommend approval and ratification of signatures:

- 1. Interagency Contract No. IAC (66-67)-179 with the Texas Department of Montal Health and Mental Retardation, signed by Business Manager J. H. Colvin, whereby the University through its Graduate School of Social Work will furnish services of its employees to give advice and consultation to the Department of Mental Health in the planning and organization of comunity mental health and mental retardation services. The period of the contract is February 1 through June 30, 1966, and the total amount involved is \$8,000.
- 2. Interagency Contract No. IAC (66-67)-189 with Prairie View Agricultural and Mechanical College, signed by Business Manager James H. Colvin, whereby the University will furnish the necessary services of clerical and other staff and will supply materials and equipment necessary to furnish Prairie View College with photocopies of documents and other materials in liqu of an interlibrary loan. The period of the contract is February 24, 1966 through August 31, 1967, and the total amount involved is not to exceed \$1,000.
- 3. Contract with the State Building Commission, signed by Business Manager James H. Colvin, whereby the University of Texas will furnish archeological services, including excavation and report preparation, at locations specified by the Commission. The period of the contract is February 18 August 31, 1966, and the total amount to be paid to the University is not to exceed \$1,000.

- 4. Loan Agreement with the Parks and Wildlife Department, signed by Graves W. Landrum, Assistant to the Chancellor, whereby the University will have the loan from the Longhorn herd at Fort Griffin State Park of a male calf with red and white markings, born January 12, 1966, which will be used as a living mascot in connection with football game activities and is to be known as Bevo IX. The University will care for and feed at its own expense the steer until its return to the Park and will reimburse the Parks and Wildlife Department for any loss or damage resulting in injury to or death of said Longhorn Steer. The agreement is effective from February 4, 1966, and shall continue indefinitely until cancelled by either party by giving thirty days notice in writing to the other party.
- 5. Fallout Shelter Licenses (seven in number), signed by Vice-Chancellor Norman Hackerman, prepared by the City of Austin, Austin-Travis County Civil Defense, and the University, providing areas in the following buildings on the University campus as fallout shelters:

Addition to Gregory Gym Undergraduate Library

Art Building

Engineering Science Building

Chemical Engineering Building
Engineering Laboratories Building
Military Physics Research Lab
Building (Balcones)

CHANGE IN NAME OF FELLOWSHIP: In 1956 Dr. Anson L. Clark established a fellowship fund in honor of his mother and requested that it be known as the "Emma Dallenbach Clark Fellowship in Psychology." Dr. Clark's donations to this fund total \$20,000. He would now like to change the name to the "Emma Frances Clark Fellowship in Psychology" since that is the name his mother used. I recommend approval.

ESTABLISHMENT OF DELTA PHI EPSILON--TILLIE ODERBOLZ SCHOLARSHIP: The alumnae of Chi Chapte: Delta Phi Epsilon Sorority, wish to establish a scholarship fund (in an initial amount of \$2,500) at Main University in memory of Mrs. Tillie Oderbolz who served faithfully as Chi Chapter housemother for approximately twenty-three years, and who died July 20, 1960. The sum is to be invested by the University, and the income therefrom is to be used for scholarship awards to undergraduate female students. Any future contributions are to be added to the principal unless any donor specifically requests the contribution to be placed in the income account. Application for such award is to be made to the Director of Student Financial Aids and the recipients will be selected by the University's Committee on Financial Aid to Students. I recommend acceptance of this scholarship.

FACULTY LEGISLATION: The following legislation has been passed by the body indicated. I recommend approval.

1. The Faculty Council on January 31, 1966, approved by the circularization procedure the proposal of the College of Arts and Sciences to change the requirement for a major in anthropology under the Degree of Bachelor of Arts, Plan I, as set out on page 50 of the Arts and Sciences Catalogue for

1965-67 (D&P 3638). The change eliminates the listing of specific courses that may be taken above the six hours of introductory freshman anthropology, and simply requires at least fifteen hours of advanced anthropology, of which six must be of senior rank, retaining the twenty-four semester hour total. This is done to make a more flexible degree programming.

- 2. The Faculty Council on February 19, 1966, approved by the circularization procedure the proposal of the College of Arts and Sciences to change the first minor requirement for a major in philosophy under the Degree of Bachelor of Arts, Plan I as set out on page 57 of the College of Arts and Sciences Catalogue for 1965-67 (D&P 3658). This legislation adds linguistics as a possible subject to choose to make up the twelve semester hours required, and also adds the choice of twelve semester hours, of which six must be upper division, in the literature of any language. The reason given is that philosophical concepts are expressed, and insights exhibited, in the literatures of Greek, Latin, English, and the Germanic, Romance, and Oriental languages. The Department of Philosophy encourages its majors to develop their competence by going beyond the minimal college requirements into advanced work in literature.
- 3. The Faculty Council at its meeting on February 21, 1966, approved the recommendations of the Deans' Council to change the regulations regarding dismissal of students for academic reasons (D&P:3650-51).

The present rules provide that a student on scholastic probation will be dismissed (1) if at the end of any long-session semester he fails to achieve the minimum standard required for his academic level; (2) if he fails to be removed from scholastic propation in three consecutive long-session semesters; (3) if he fails to pass any work in any long-session semester; or (4) if he withdraws during a long-session semester, he is counted as having failed to satisfy the required minimum standards and re-entry is limited. The present rule also states that if the required minimum of work in the case of a student who is on scholastic probation cannot be determined because of the symbol R, such student is considered to have failed. The proposed legislation provides that dismissal under these conditions (or failure because of the \underline{R} symbol) obtains only if the student has less than a cumulative C average. In other words, no student will be dismissed for academic reasons unless (1) he has less than an over-all C average and (2) according to the present rule, he has failed to pass the necessary number of hours and make the necessary number of grade points during a semester while on scholastic probation. This material appears in the General Information bulletin (Publication number 6513, July 1, 1965), page 63.

- 4. The Graduate Assembly on February 7, 1966, recommended that any student registering in the Graduate School who has completed two years of a major modern foreign language with an average grade of B or better at any undergraduate college on a list to be compiled by the Office of the Graduate Dean in conjunction with representatives of the Main University language departments shall be deemed to have satisfied the basic language requirement of the Graduate School where such applies to doctoral programs. Other students may satisfy the requirements by taking two years at the University or by examination.
- 5. The Graduate Assembly at its meeting on February 7, 1966, recommended that beginning September 1, 1966, Graduate Studies Committees are empowered to accept three hours of supervised and evaluated teaching experience in their individual academic areas, or by joint action of two or more Graduate Studies

Committees in interdisciplinary areas, for credit on a master's program or listing for evaluation on a doctoral program, these three hours, however, not to be accepted in lieu of a thesis or the alternate method for meeting the terminal requirement in the master's program now in existence.

OUTSIDE EMPLOYMENT: I recommend that the persons listed below be permitted to undertake the outside duties specified for each, the work to be arranged so as not to interfere with University assignments and otherwise to conform to Chapter III, Sec. 13, of Part I of the Rules and Regulations of the Board of Regents for the Government of The University of Texas:

- 1. Mr. Richard Adams, Professor of Anthropology and Acting Director of the Latin-American Institute, to act as Executive Secretary of the Committee on Latin American Educational Cooperation for Education and World Affairs.
- 2. Mr. Harlan Smith, Professor of Astronomy, to act as consultant on scientific selection and design of experiments for planetary fly-by missions for General Dynamics, Fort Worth, Texas.
- 3. Mr. Keith E. Morrison, Professor of Law, to prepare legal memoranda on estate planning and taxation for an attorney in Dallas.

USE OF FACULTY-AUTHORED BOOKS AS TEXTBOOKS: I recommend that the following books written by members of the faculty be approved for use as textbooks:

- 1. Readings in Physical Anthropology, by T. W. McKern, Associate Professor of Anthropology, published by Prentice-Hall, Inc., which sells for \$4.20 with royalty to author of 10% of first 5,000 copies sold and 15% thereafter.
- 2. <u>Elementary Bacteriology</u>, by <u>Orville Wyss</u>, Professor of Microbiology, O. B. Williams and E. W. Gardner, published by John Wiley, which sells for \$5.95 with royalty of 40¢ per copy to faculty member.
- 3. <u>Laboratory Manual for Elementary Microbiology</u>, (for Microbiology 316) by Orville Wyss and C. E. Eklund, both of the Department of Microbiology, published by John Wiley, which sells for \$2.95 with royalty of 29¢ to authors.
- 4. <u>Laboratory Manual</u>, (for Microbiology 619) by C. E. Eklund and C. E. Lankford, both of the Department of Microbiology, published by the University Co-Op, which sells for \$4.50 with royalty of 63¢ each to authors.

Institute funds allotted to Project L-535, under Professor Norgaard's direction. Approval has also been given for Dr. Norgaard to make several round trips during the semester from Austin to Los Angeles at approximate cost of \$160 each, payment to be made from the account indicated above.
