In connection with the construction of the initial facilities to house The University of Texas Dental School at San Antonio and The University of Texas (Clinical) Nursing School at San Antonio, an appropriation of \$350,000.00 was made from the two Legislative appropriations for the schools involved (October 31, 1969 Board of Regents Minutes). In order that a division of expenditures may be made between these two appropriations, it is recommended that the appropriation for the San Antonio Dental School provide \$235,000.00 and the appropriation for the San Antonio (Clinical) Nursing School provide \$115,000.00, this division being based approximately on the amount of space provided for each school within the initial facilities being constructed.

<u>ACADEMIC AND BUSINESS CONTRACTS:</u> The following contracts have been executed at The University of Texas at Austin. I recommend approval and ratification of signatures:

- 1. Agreement with the Guadalupe-Blanco River Authority, signed by Vice-President James H. Colvin, whereby the University through its Bureau of Business Research will expand the economic projections of a region along the Guadalupe River between New Braunfels and Seguin which were made under a similar grant during the period September 18, 1968-June 30, 1969. The estimated total budget is \$6,500, the work to begin immediately and to be completed as soon as feasible after the preliminary reports on the 1970 census become available.
- 2. Interagency Cooperation Contract No. IAC(70-71)-255 with the Texas Highway Department, signed by Vice-President James H. Colvin, whereby the University will furnish educational facilities for registered employees of the Highway Department. The total to be paid to the University to cover tuition and fees is \$204, and the period of the contract is February 24 August 31, 1970.
- 3. Interagency Cooperation Contract No. IAC(70-71)-259 with Texas State Library, signed by Vice-President James H. Colvin, whereby the University through its Library will fill all inter-library loan requests which the Texas State Library Communications Network has been unable to meet. The period of the contract is February 18, 1970-January 31, 1971, and the total amount is not to exceed \$4,644.
- 4. Interagency Cooperation Contract No. IAC(70-71)-258 with the Texas State Historical Survey Committee, signed by Vice-President James H. Colvin, whereby the University through its Texas Archeological Research Library, will conduct an archeological investigation at the George C. Davis Site in Cherokee County, Texas, including research, excavation, and recording at the Caddoan temple mound and village site. The period of the contract is June 1, 1970 May 31, 1971, and the total amount is not to exceed \$3,000.

<u>FACULTY LEGISLATION:</u> The following legislation has been passed by the General Faculty and/or the University Council. I recommend approval.

- 1. On February 5, 1970, the General Faculty approved by the circularization procedure the proposal of the University Council that the Dean of Students and the Vice-President of the Students' Association be voting members of the University Council, ex-officio (GFM 9905).
- 2. At its meeting on February 16, 1970, the University Council approved the motion that the courses and abbreviations in the Department of Physical Instruction be changed in line with the name of the department.

- On February 13, 1970, the University Council approved by the circularization procedure the proposed changes in the School of Architecture Catalogue (D&P 4563-64) as follows: Under the six-year program, for a Bachelor of Architecture degree Physics 609 is specified instead of Physics 801, the latter a technical course while 609 is a nontechnical course. This would reduce the requirements by two semester hours except that Architecture 408L is changed to Architecture 608L. The same changes are to be made in the five-year program for the Bachelor of Architecture degree, and the following reasons are given: The faculty in Architecture believes that a more comprehensive survey of the art and profession of architecture is essential at the earliest possible time in the curriculum in order to provide the entering freshman with an understanding of architecture as it is practiced today. This requires the expansion of the content of the existing Architecture 408L course. With a significant number of students who are able to achieve advance standing in freshmen courses, it will be possible for these students to take Architecture 608L in the first year. The physics course is considered as being for enrichment rather than for technical preparation, and this change will enable the student to maintain a reasonable course load in the first year which will include Architecture 608L whenever possible.
- 4. At its meeting on February 16, 1970, the University Council approved the proposal to add three students as voting members of the Faculty Building Advisory Committee. These students are to be appointed by the President of the University of Texas at Austin from a panel of six students nominated by a committee composed of the Dean of the School of Architecture, the President of the Architecture Council, the elected Architecture Assemblyman, the President and the Vice-President of the Students' Association. No two students are to be from the same school or college.
- 5. On March 10, 1970, the University Council approved by the circularization procedure, the proposed changes in wording for requirements for Bachelor of Journalism, Bachelor of Science in Radio-Television-Film, and Bachelor of Science in Speech (D&P 4582-83). In each program the twelve semester hours of English is reduced to nine, still requiring six hours above the freshman level. This is done to conform to the new English requirements in the College of Arts and Sciences where students have to satisfy the first semester of freshman English either by advanced standing examination or by taking the course, but without university credit therefor.

EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITY GRANT: The initial year allocation of \$128,158 has been increased by \$4,900, raising the total to the new level \$264,199 for the period July 1, 1969- June 30, 1970.

COLLEGE WORK-STUDY PROGRAM: The Department of Health, Education, and Welfare has made a grant of \$103,100 for the College Work-Study Program at The University of Texas at Austin for the period January 1 - December 31, 1970.

ESTABLISHMENT OF T.S. PAINTER MEMORIAL FUND: Dr. T. S. Painter, who died October 5, 1969, had been on the faculty of The University of Texas at Austin since 1916, beginning as Adjunct Professor of Zoology and becoming Professor in 1924, and Distinguished Professor in 1939. He served as Acting President of the University from November 1, 1944 to May 23, 1946, when he was made President. He served in this capacity until August 31, 1952 when he returned to full-time teaching and research. Gifts have been made in his memory and it is proposed that the fund collected be used in the field of cytology. Since there is no way to determine the size of the fund, decision will be made later as to whether an endowment fund will be established with income only used or whether the principal sum will be expended over a given number of years. I recommend that a T. S. Painter Memorial Fund be established and that the specific nature of the fund be determined later, as well as the procedure for its use.

ESTABLISHMENT OF DOUGLAS N. MORGAN MEMORIAL FUND - ARTS AND SCIENCES
FOUNDATION: Dr. D. N. Morgan, who died May 30, 1979, came to The University of
Texas at Austin as Professor of Philosophy the second semester of the 1959-60 school
year. Dr. Morgan was an outstanding scholar and teacher. It was he who coached the
University team that won first place in the College Bowl television series. The Department of Philosophy has requested that the contributions that have been received in his
memory be used to establish the memorial fund as an endowment, from which will be paid
each year one \$50 scholarship or award. The Department of Philosophy will have jurisdiction over the fund, and until the total fund is sufficient to produce the \$50, the principal may be used to supplement it.

ESTABLISHMENT OF W. H. IRONS MEMORIAL LECTURE FUND IN BANKING AND FINANCE: Dr. W. H. Irons came to The University of Texas at Austin in 1936 as Assistant Professor of Business Administration, with specialization in the field of finance. He became Professor in 1942 and resigned June 30, 1946, to accept a position with the Federal Reserve Bank of Dallas as Vice-President, becoming President in 1954. He retired in February 1968, and died on October 23 of that year. It is the wish of his friends and of Mrs. Irons that contributions made in his memory be used to establish a fund at The University of Texas as an endowment, the income from which will be used to bring a lecturer of note in the field of banking or finance. The Dean of the College of Business Administration will select the lecturer after inviting recommendations from the faculty or from such other sources as he desires. If in any two-year period, the income from the fund exceeds the amount needed, the difference will be returned to the principal.

ESTABLISHMENT OF LOCKART SCHOLARSHIP IN COLLEGE OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION: Mr. and Mrs. James E. Lockart, Jr., of Dallas, have made a gift to the Chancellor's Council for the benefit of the College of Business Administration. The fund is to be an endowment, the income from which will be used to produce a \$1,000 scholarship in the Graduate School of Business Administration at Austin. The recipient is to be chosen from undergraduates of the College of Business Administration at Austin by Dean Kozmetsky at his sole discretion. Should Dean Kozmetsky leave the University, their son, James E. Lockart, III, will determine the recipient.

ESTABLISHMENT OF PRENTICE HILL - DEACON CRAIN SCHOLARSHIP FUND FOR PLAY-WRITING STUDENTS AND DESIGN STUDENTS IN DRAMA: Dr. William H. Crain has made an initial contribution of \$3,400 to establish a scholarship fund in memory of Prentice Hill, a former student in the Department of Drama in the field of design, now deceased. Only the income will be used for scholarships, the awards to be under the direction of the Department of Drama.

ESTABLISHMENT OF THE FRED STEINMARK FUND: The Great Southwest Corporation has sent a check in the amount of \$20,000 as an endowment account under the name of The Fred Steinmark Fund. Fred Steinmark in his junior year was a member of the Longhorn football team that won the 1969 National Championship, playing in the last conference game of the season against Arkansas. A week later his left leg had to be amputated. The primary purpose of the fund is to acknowledge and honor the character and courage exhibited by Fred Steinmark especially during his illness, and to assist outstanding young people who also express such qualities. The principal is to be held in perpetuity with the income used to make awards and/or grants in aid to members and former members of athletic teams at The University of Texas at Austin. The awardees must be students at the time the award is made, or must be under mental or physical disability which occurred at a time that the awardee was a student and such disability as prevents continuation of student status. The award committee is the Athletic Director of The University of Texas at Austin, who may, at his discretion, appoint additional committee members. The award committee is to have full and unrestricted freedom in selecting the recipient and may from time to time abolish or establish additional criteria.




The policy statement below, to be published in the School catalogue, is recommended by the Dean and Associate Deans and has been approved by Deputy Chancellor LeMaistre:

Assignment of Students to Clinical Branches

In order to assure a distribution of students among the Nursing School branches which will provide for the best use of physical and human resources, students will be assigned to campuses for the clinical years according to the following guidelines:

- 1. Students whose families reside within commuting distance of a branch and who plan to live at home will, if they wish, be enrolled at that branch.
- 2. Students who cannot or choose not to commute from the family home will have the opportunity to express, in preferential order, their desires for assignment. By lot, each one will receive a priority number and on the basis of this number he will be awarded his first, second, or third choice, within the quotas (maximums and minimums) established for each branch.
- 3. If exchanges can be arranged by students among themselves, they will be allowed. Such arrangements are the responsibility of the students and not of the Nursing School.
- 4. Assignment to a clinical branch is for the duration of the student's program.

The following plans for health services for nursing students enrolled on the Austin campus have been developed in consultation with Dr. Paul Trickett, director, and Mr. John Wilson, business manager, of the Student Health Center, and approved by Deputy Chancellor LeMaistre.

Student Health Services Austin Campus

Transfer students will be expected to comply with the admission requirements of the Student Health Center as they relate to the physical examination, chest x-ray, and immunizations. No special health services will be required for those students who enroll on the Austin campus for one semester only (summer or regular session) before transferring to one of the clinical nursing schools. The only one of the services which they may not have had prior to transferring is the tuberculin skin test.

For all students who have been on the Austin campus for at least one year prior to enrolling for the first nursing course, the first annual physical examination will be done at the beginning of the semester in which they enroll for this course. A record of services which will follow will be kept by the Nursing School, and the Student Health Center will be notified as students are due to report for services. The Health Center will make contact with the student and will arrange appointments which will be adaptable to the Center's normal activities.

Students having their first annual physical examination after admission in July will be placed on a July-January schedule for services, those admitted in the Fall on a September-March schedule, and those admitted in the Spring on a February-August schedule. This schedule cannot be rigidly adhered to for obvious reasons, but will be followed as closely as is possible.

The cost of the annual physical examination (exclusive of immunization) will be \$15.00. Those students who have not had smallpox vaccination or adult tetanus diphtheria toxoid (full series or booster) within the past three years will receive these immunizations at the time of the physical examination. At the end of each six months, a 14x17 chest x-ray and tuberculin skin test (for reactors) will be done at a cost to the student of \$5.00. Nose and throat cultures required prior to enrollment for certain courses will be done at a cost of \$1.00. The total cost of the health services to the student who is on the Austin campus for four years will be approximately \$56.00. This covers the cost of 3 complete physical examinations, 2 chest x-rays, and the nose and throat culture. It is anticipated that this will be the maximum cost to any student, and the cost will be less for students completing nursing courses in less than two and one-half years.

Dr. Margretta Styles is recommended by the Committee on Graduate Studies and the Dean of the Nursing School for membership on the graduate faculty of the Nursing School. She meets the requirements set forth by the Board of Regents, and her appointment has been approved by Deputy Chancellor LeMaistre.
