REPORT OF AMENDMENTS TO THE 1966-67 CENTRAL ADMINISTRATION BUDGET

<u>FACULTY LEGISLATION</u>: The following legislation has been passed by the Faculty Council and/or General Faculty. I recommend approval.

On March 1, 1967, the Faculty Council approved by the circularization procedure the catalogue changes in the School of Law (D&P 3862-66).

The first change deals with admission to candidacy for the Master of Laws degree. The legislation makes the admission policy more flexible but does not relax the requirements. These changes will limit the number and improve the quality of the LL. M. candidates by requiring a higher over-all average in the LL. B. work for admission to the Master's program. These changes also reduce the quantity of work required for the LL. M. to make possible an improvement in the quality. The number of semester hours needed at present are twenty-six, of which six are usually in the form of individual research credit earned by writing an acceptable thesis. The recommended legislation provides that sixteen hours of course and seminar work be required, not counting the thesis. The thesis will not be counted in credit hours.

This legislation also recommends that the course description for "Individual Research" be amended so that credit will be given for the course without any committee review since it is felt that if a faculty member and the Dean have approved the research project and the supervising faculty member has approved the paper, credit should be given without further review.

The third part of this legislation deals with the material under "Grades and Credits" and "Standard of Work Required." This change would eliminate any substitution of grades by repeating a course and having the higher grade recorded. The present "substitution" rule allows the students to remain in Law School almost indefinitely. Also, the new rule substitutes the completion of 20 hours for two semesters in determining the status of students who enter in the fall. At present a student who completes as many as seven hours in nine months with an over-all average of less than 63 is dropped for failure. The new legislation also provides that the minimum grade that can be averaged with the final examination grade is 50 instead of 55 to encourage the student study seriously for the final examination.

- 2. On March 20, 1967, the Faculty Council adopted the Proposed Advanced Placement Examinations in the Department of Required Health and Physical Education for Men (D&P 3875) with an amendment in the wording by eliminating the word "clearly" before "superior" in rating and qualifying. This legislation permits a student to be given credit for one semester of physical education for each activity in which he qualifies.
- 3. On March 20, 1967, the Faculty Council adopted the Proposed Amendments to the Catalogue of the College of Education (D&P 3859-61) as set out below:
 - l. Change the Admission Requirements by requiring two units each of a foreign language, a natural science, and a social science, whereas formerly only four units total were required in this area, two from any two of the three subjects listed.

- 2. Change the prescribed work in Academic Foundations for the degree of Bachelor of Science in Education, for Bachelor of Science in Elementary Education, and Bachelor of Science in Physical Education, to provide a more flexible program for all students in the Teacher Education Program, recognizing that many of them will use the increased number of electives to go more deeply into any area of the humanities, social sciences, natural sciences, mathematics and fine arts. These changes will standardize the work in Academic Foundations for all three degrees granted in the College of Education. There is no change in the total number of hours needed for the degrees.
- 4. On March 20, 1967, the Faculty Council approved the recommendation of the College of Education (D&P 3874) that since foreign language units are now required for entrance, provision be made for removal of deficiency in this area by requiring completion of courses 406 and 407 of a language course, the 406 course not to be counted as credit toward a degree. The "Removal of Deficiencies" section pertaining to the College of Education now appears in the 1966-67 General Information bulletin on page 33.
- 5. On March 22, 1967, the Faculty Council approved by the circularization procedure the catalogue changes in the College of Arts and Sciences (D&P 3877-79). This legislation deals with the Requirements for the Degree of Bachelor of Arts, Plan II, and is largely a rewrite of the previous catalogue material in order to clarify or to emphasize certain features and requirements of the program. The specific change involves the substitution of Physical Science 601Q in the sophomore year for a range of introductory physics and chemistry courses. This is a new course, designed for second-year Plan II students, and taught jointly by members of the physics and chemistry departments faculty. It will provide a broader and more experimental approach to physical sciences for Plan II students not intending to do advanced work in physics and chemistry.

- 1. Mr. James E. Boggs, Professor of Chemistry, to act as consultant to National Aeronatics and Space Administration at Langley Research Center on problems of mutual interest to NASA and to his research group at the University.
- 2. Mr. Lorrin Kennamer, Professor of Geography, to serve as a Field Reader for Bureau of Research, U. S. Office of Education, to evaluate specific research proposals in the social sciences.

- 3. Mr. E. S. Redford, Professor of Government, to act as consultant to the U. S. Department of Agriculture on statement of Secretary of Agriculture for hearing on intergovernmental relations.
- 5. Mr. M. K. Woodward, Professor of Law, to prepare for Phillips Petroleum Company a memorandum on legal questions in a pending suit.
- 6. Mr. Alex Berman, Associate Professor of Pharmacy, to act as consultant to the U.S. Department of Health, Education, and Welfare, Public Health Service, on grant applications for the division of hospital and medical facilities and participate in site visits in connection therewith.
- 7. Mr. Richard Beard, Assistant Professor of General Business, to teach two courses at Huston-Tillotson College during the spring. No other instructor was available to Huston-Tillotson and the courses would have had to be discontinued had Mr. Beard not agreed to teach them.

The following docket is submitted for your approval and presentation to the Board of Regents at its meeting in Austin on May 5-6, 1967:

APPOINTMENTS FOR MEMBERSHIP ON THE MEDICAL STAFF OF THE UNIVERSITY OF TEXAS MEDICAL BRANCH HOSPITALS: On recommendation of the Executive Committee of the Medical Staff in accordance with the By-Laws and Rules and Regulations of the Medical Staff, approval is requested for the following appointments for membership on the Medical Staff:

- 1. Roy Lee Emken, M.D., Instructor, Department of Neurology and Psychiatry, full-time, active membership on the Medical Staff.
- 2. Paul Jahnke, M.D., Instructor, Department of Ophthalmology, full-time, active membership on the Medical Staff.
- 3. Lennart L. Kopra, Ph.D., Clinical Professor, Department of Pediatrics, part-time, associate membership on the Medical Staff.

NEPOTISM: On recommendation of the Administrative Council, approval of the following case involving nepotism is recommended:

1. Under authority of Section 5.43, Chapter III, Part One of the Rules and Regulations of the Board of Regents of The University of Texas, approval is requested for the waiver of the Nepotism Rule in favor of Dr. Barbara Kolmen, Clinical Assistant Professor, part-time (10%), in the Department of Pediatrics, at a salary rate of \$13,200 for twelve months, effective March 1, 1967. Dr. Barbara Kolmen is the wife of Dr. Samuel N. Kolmen, Associate Professor in the Department of Physiology.

EMPLOYMENT OF AN INDIVIDUAL OVER AGE 65: Dr. Cecil H. Connell, Professor of Preventive Medicine and Public Health, has a special grant from the Soap and Detergent Association, New York, N. Y., for studies on Phosphate Removal at the Texas City Wastewater Treatment Plant. An engineer-chemist is needed to act as supervising technologist for the Demonstration Studies involved in this program. Such an individual is not only very difficult to find, but would also be quite expensive to employ. Mr. Sevrin M. Frey, a highly qualified individual, has agreed to accept the position with appointment as Research Associate I at a salary of \$7,104 per annum. Mr. Frey is 67 years of age, but apparently is in very good health. Prior to his retirement he was employed for 15 years as Director of the Works Laboratory at Union Carbide in Texas City with about 30 chemical engineers, analytical chemists and analysts under his supervision, and with the responsibility for quality control of chemical production of the Plant. We recommend approval of Mr. Sevrin M. Frey's appointment as Research Associate I in the Department of Preventive Medicine and Public Health at a salary rate of \$7,104 for the period January 1, 1967 through August 31, 1967, to be paid from the grant.

THE JAMES W. MCLAUGHLIN FELLOWSHIP FUND: On recommendation of the Medical Branch McLaughlin Committee for the James W. McLaughlin Fellowship Fund, approval of the following recommendations is respectfully recommended:
