#### REPORT OF AMENDMENTS TO THE 1969-70 SYSTEM ADMINISTRATION BUDGET

#### Office of the Chancellor

Appoint James W. Wagener as Coordinator for Academic Program Planning at an annual salary rate of \$19,000 effective June 1, 1970. Source of Funds: System Administration Unallocated Account. (RBC's #101, 102)

## HOLIDAY AND VACATION SCHEDULE FOR U.T. SYSTEM

The State Appropriations Bill provides a total of thirteen(13) specified holidays plus two (2) working days at Christmas to be observed by salaried employees of State agencies during the fiscal year 1970-71.

The Appropriations Bill, however, also provides that "holidays falling on Saturdays and Sundays shall not be observed by closing State Offices on the preceding or following days." One (1) of the thirteen (13) specified holidays falls on Sunday, thus reducing by one(1) the total number of working days to be observed as holidays by the University. The Appropriations Bill further provides a maximum of ten(10) working days of vacation for "annual employees of the State."

State institutions of higher education are, however, privileged to rearrange holiday and vacation schedules within the total number of days provided. I recommend the following dates, therefore, to be observed as holidays for the fiscal year 1970-71:

With the approval of this recommendation, the two(2) additional State Legal Holidays not observed by the University will be added to the statutory allowance to provide a total of twelve(12) working days annual leave for 1970-71, which has been the practice for a number of years.

The Appropriations Bill also provides that "annual employees with fifteen(15) or more years of employment with the State shall be entitled to two(2) normal work weeks plus five(5) additional normal working days of vacation in any one(1) fiscal year" and "Annual employees with twenty(20) or more years of employment with the State shall be entitled to two(2) normal weeks plus ten(10) additional working days of vacation in any one(1) fiscal year." Therefore, University employees with fifteen(15) years' State employment shall be entitled to seventeen(17) working days; and employees with twenty(20) years' State employment shall be entitled to twenty-two(22) working days annual leave for 1970-71 under the above provisions of the Appropriations Bill.

The foregoing holiday and vacation schedule is the same as that recommended for The University of Texas at Austin and is recommended for your approval to apply to The University of Texas System Administration and to any component institution in The University of Texas System that does not request a schedule specifically different.

FACULTY LEGISLATION: The following legislation has been passed by the General Faculty and/or University Council. I recommend approval.

1. The University Council on May 14, 1970, approved by the circularization procedure the proposed change in the Bachelor of Journalism degree (D&P 4622). This legislation under Plan I: News Studies eliminates J. 324 from required courses (since it has been dropped from offerings) and adds J. 361, which assures that transfer students will be required to take at least one upper-division news reporting course at UT Austin.

The University Council on June 4, 1970, approved by the circularization procedure the recommendation of the College of Arts and Sciences relating to disallowing credit toward graduation in Arts and Sciences for English 301 (D&P 4634). The legislation eliminating credit for English 301 from total number of hours required for a degree in Arts and Sciences was passed by the Faculty (now University) Council at the March 18, 1968, meeting and approved by the Regents at the May 1968 meeting, the change to be effective September 1, 1970. The present legislation requests that implementation of the rule be post-2353 poned until at least September 1972. The English Department is to submit definite proposals to the College no later than October 15, 1971. The reason given is that it is impossible to determine with any accuracy at present how many students will be required to take English 301 next fall without credit towards graduation. On the basis of past experience with exemption examination and patterns of registration in the colleges and schools it is estimated that at least two thousand freshmen will be placed in 30l and that, of these two thousand, one-third or less will receive graduation credit, (because they are enrolled in colleges that will continue to give graduation credit for English 301), twothirds or more will not. The number in English 301 could be much larger than two thousand if the enrollment increases or if the percentage of freshman exempted decreases sharply when the entire class is required to take the examination. At present only half take the examination, and it can be presumed that the other half includes many who are weak in English. By December 1971, when decisions must be made about programs for 1972, the Department will have more reliable figures on the exemption rate, and the University's policies on future growth in enrollment should be clearer.

## <u>Vacation Schedule</u>

Two additional State Legal Holidays not observed by the University will be added to the statutory allowance to provide a total of twelve (12) working days annual leave for 1970-71, which has been the practice for a number of years.

In accordance with the Appropriation Bill, annual employees with fifteen or more years of employment with the State are entitled to an additional five (5) days of vacation, making a total of seventeen (17) working days annual leave, and those with twenty or more years of employment with the State are entitled to an additional ten (10) days, making a total of twenty-two (22) working days annual leave.

ESTABLISHMENT OF LYNDA B. JOHNSON ROBB AWARD: Mr. John Fleming of New York City has sent \$2,000 to establish the Lynda B. Johnson Robb Award fund, the income from which will provide an award of not more than \$100 a year for the university student who submits the best collection of children's books each spring. Should the income in any year exceed \$100, the difference will be added to the principal until such time as it produces an additional \$100 at which time a directive will be forthcoming as to its use. Chancellor Ransom will sign for disbursal of the fund. I recommend acceptance.

COLLEGE WORK-STUDY PROGRAM: The total approved level of federal expenditures for the period January 1 - December 31, 1970, is \$311,100. Of this amount \$103,100 are funds previously approved which are to be expended on or before June 30, 1970, and the balance, \$208,000, is the allocation for the second six months of 1970. Total level approved for 1969 was \$224,338, including a supplemental award of \$31,583.

EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITY GRANTS: The allocation level for the fiscal year 1971 is \$307,700; the total for 1970 was \$259,299. Of this total \$152,600 is for initial year grants and \$155,100 for renewal grants. The renewal grant may be increased by borrowing from initial year grant, but the initial year total cannot be exceeded.



#### VACATION SCHEDULE

The annual vacation entitlement for eligible employees will be a maximum of twelve (12) working days for fiscal year 1970-71. Persons who have been continuously employed for six months or longer, and on at least a half-time basis, are eligible to take annual leave to the extent of one (1) day (or the appropriate fraction thereof) for each month of continuous employment in the current fiscal year, not to exceed twelve (12) working days. Annual employees with fifteen (15) or more years of employment with the State shall be entitled to two (2) normal work weeks plus five (5) additional normal working days of vacation in any one (1) fiscal year and Annual employees with twenty (20) or more years of employment with the State shall be entitled to two (2) normal weeks plus ten (10) additional working days of vacation in any one (1) fiscal year. Therefore, University employees with fifteen (15) years' State employment shall be entitled to seventeen (17) working days; and employees with twenty (20) years' State employment shall be entitled to twenty-two (22) working days annual leave for 1970-71.

# PARKING AND TRAFFIC REGULATIONS 1970-71

The following Parking and Traffic Regulations are recommended for approval effective September 1, 1970. These regulations have been revised with a number of editorial changes, but the only substantive changes involve assignment of parking areas to freshmen students, a modified refund procedure for students who withdraw from school, and a strengthened enforcement procedure for those receiving traffic citations.

# PARKING AND TRAFFIC REGULATIONS 1970-71

### 1. General Information

### A. Scope

These regulations promulgated by the Board of Regents under authority of Senate Bill No. 162, Chapter 80, Acts 60th Legislature Regular Session, 1967, govern the operation and parking of motor vehicles on property under the jurisdiction of The University of Texas at Arlington. The purpose of these regulations is to control traffic and parking and the use of parking facilities, provide for the issuance of vehicle identification insignia, and provide for jurisdiction over offenses. In particular, Campus Security officers may issue TRAFFIC TICKETS ENFORCEABLE IN COURT in the same way as those issued by the City of Arlington police or the Texas Department of Public Safety. These regulations are supplementary to the rules and regulations of the City of Arlington and the State of Texas which govern the use of motor vehicles. THE SPEED LIMIT ON ALL PARTS OF THE CAMPUS IS 20 MILES PER HOUR. PEDESTRIANS SHALL HAVE THE RIGHT OF WAY AT ALL TIMES.

The following regulations are in force at The University of Texas at Arlington:

- (1) The regulations governing the use of motor vehicles must be complied with on all parts of the campus throughout all hours of the day and night.
- (2) The term "vehicle" or "motor vehicle" includes automobiles, trucks, motorcycles, motorbikes, and scooters.
- (3) The University of Texas at Arlington assumes no responsibility for the care and/or protection of any vehicle or its contents at any time it is operated or parked on its campus. The University also reserves the right to impound any vehicle which is parked with serious impropriety or so as to obstruct vehicular or pedestrian traffic. The term "impounding" includes removal or immobilization of the vehicle. The owners of impounded vehicles will be required to pay all costs involved in impounding and storing.
  - (4) Regulations posted on signs apply at all times.
- (5) The Chief of Campus Security shall have discretionary powers to enforce a policy of traffic control on the campus when the same is not specifically provided for by these rules.
- (6) There will be no parking on any street which is owned or controlled by The University of Texas at Arlington except where such parking is specifically indicated by posted signs.
  - B. Students, Staff and Faculty Parking
- (1) All persons except visitors must register their vehicles with the Campus Security Office at 302 Third Street on or before the date they commence operating their vehicle on the campus.
- (2) A student is defined as any person enrolled in The University of Texas at Arlington. This includes day, night, short courses, special, audit and seminar students.

- (3) All personnel employed by the University are either regularly salaried or part-time (temporary) employees. These categories are broken down into Staff (both professional and non-professional) and Faculty. Only full-time employees are eligible to park in the Faculty/Staff parking lots.
- (4) The available parking facilities have been classified into three categories: Inner, Intermediate, and Outer. The Inner zone is designated for Faculty/Staff parking, the Intermediate zone for upperclassmen parking, and the Outer zone for Freshmen. (A Freshman is defined as a student who has completed less than 30 semester credit hours.)
- (5) Upon registration and payment of the parking fee, a numbered decal will be issued which will permit the holder to park in the area designated by the decal. Student parking areas are A, B, C, T, H, or M; Staff and Faculty, 0, 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7 and 8.

### C. Visitor Parking

A visitor is defined as a person who is neither a student nor an employee of the University, nor is he a person who uses campus parking facilities for the benefit of a student or employee. There has been provided, in a majority of all Faculty/Staff lots, a limited number of parking spaces for visitors. UNDER NO CIRCUMSTANCES ARE STUDENTS OR EMPLOYEES ALLOWED TO PARK IN THE VISITORS AREA. Visitors parking in areas not designated for visitors will be charged with a parking violation. Illegally parked vehicles may also be towed away or impounded at the owner's expense.

### 2. Parking Fees

Effective September 1, 1970, the fees for parking at UT Arlington shall be:

- A. All parking fees are payable at the Bursar's Office prior to the registration of a motor vehicle.
- B. Students who are graduated at the end of the fall semester or who terminate their enrollment for other reasons at the end of the fall semester or Faculty/Staff members who terminate their employment at the end of the fall semester may receive a partial refund of the parking fee in accordance with the table below, provided they turn in the remnants of their decal.

- C. Multiple vehicles owned by one person may be registered with Campus Security provided that proof of ownership is shown at the time of registration. The additional fee is \$1.00 for each additional vehicle which is registered. ONLY ONE VEHICLE MAY BE PARKED ON CAMPUS AT ANY GIVEN TIME.
- D. Persons who have previously registered only one vehicle may register multiple vehicles as in "C" above provided they (1) turn in the remnants of the old decal, (2) pay the additional fee required, and (3) show proof of ownership. ONLY ONE VEHICLE MAY BE PARKED ON CAMPUS AT ANY GIVEN TIME.
- E. Rider-Pool students who pay for one vehicle may obtain a special Rider Pool decal for rotation of vehicles. The fee is \$1.00 for each additional vehicle, not to exceed four. ONLY ONE VEHICLE MAY BE PARKED ON CAMPUS AT ANY GIVEN TIME.
- F. Individuals having physical handicaps may apply for special parking assignments by submitting a letter to the Campus Security Office setting forth the reason for the request. A written confirmation must be received from the University Health Center before Campus Security will issue a handicap decal.
- G. Temporary Parking Permits may be purchased for \$1.00 for seven consecutive days. These permits will allow students, Faculty, and Staff members who have not previously registered a vehicle to bring that vehicle on campus for short periods of time.

# 3. Procedures

### A. Position of Decal

A permit to park on campus will not be honored unless the decal is properly affixed to the lower left-hand corner of the back glass, except convertibles and station wagons or any other vehicle whose rear window is concealed. For these vehicles the decal must be affixed to the lower right-hand corner of the windshield. Application directions are provided with the decal. It may not be affixed by tape or other unauthorized material. Permits are not transferrable and must be affixed to the vehicle for which they are issued.

# B. Replacement Decals

A replacement decal will be issued without charge whenever there is a sale or transfer of the vehicle, a replacement of the rear window or windshield, or defective decal provided the remnants of the original decal are turned in to Campus Security. Otherwise, a \$1.00 fee will be charged and proof of ownership of the vehicle to be registered must be shown. A decal holder is eligible for up to three reissues; thereafter, the \$1.00 fee must be paid for each decal reissued.

### C. Special Temporary Permits

If after having bought a parking permit it becomes necessary to use a non-registered vehicle for emergency or other reasons, a special parking permit must be secured from the Campus Security Office and affixed to the vehicle in the proper manner. A special temporary permit will be given for periods not to exceed five (5) school days and no more than three (3) in succession.

### D. Enforcement

- (1) To continue parking on campus, students, staff and faculty members who have received a parking citation are required to pay a \$2.00 reinstatement fee at the Bursar's Office within five (5) calendar days from the date of the citation.
- (2) If the offender wishes to appeal a citation, he must do so within five (5) calendar days from the date of the citation. A formal written notice of appeal must be executed by the offender on forms available in the Bursar's Office. Such written appeal will contain the circumstances deemed pertinent to the particular citation. The Chairman of the Appeals Board will notify the appellant by mail as to the date and time of the consideration of his appeal.
- (3) The person appealing may be present for the hearing and will be allowed five (5) minutes for a personal presentation of his appeal. If he is not present, the case will be decided on the basis of the facts contained in the written appeal.
- (4) An offender will have five (5) calendar days after the expiration of the appeal period to pay the reinstatement fee of \$2.00. Or, if an appeal was filed, he will have five (5) calendar days to pay the \$2.00 reinstatement fee if the Appeals Board finds him guilty of the violation.
- (5) A Court Appearance Ticket will be written on the violation if the offender does not pay the reinstatement fee within the time limit set forth in Item No. 4 above. After three (3) Court Appearance Tickets have been written within a permit year, the offender's campus parking privileges will be revoked for the remainder of that permit year. Criminal penalties, as provided by law, may be imposed by the Justice Court for violations of University Parking and Traffic Regulations.

# 4. Parking Regulations

# A. Controlled Facilities

The controlled parking area will include the University parking lots and street areas abutting University property. Signs have been placed in the area to designate it as a controlled parking area.

(1) After 3 p.m., lots 3, 4, and 99 are "dual lots" and may be used for Faculty/Staff and Student Parking, provided the user has a valid registration decal on the vehicle.

- (2) Dormitory students with valid dormitory decals may use any "A" lot between 2:30 p.m. and 7 a.m. daily.
- (3) Faculty and staff members who have obtained parking decals may use any faculty parking lot on campus between 2:30 p.m. and 7 a.m. daily.

# B. General Regulations

- (1) The speed limit for motor vehicles in the area is 20 miles per hour except where slower speed is essential for safety.
- (2) Unnecessary noise from horns, mufflers, or any other noise-making device is prohibited.
- (3) Vehicles operated on the campus must be in safe driving condition and have current license tags.
- (4) The registered owner of a permit is responsible for each traffic violation involving motor vehicles registered to him or her.
- (5) Every car is required to stop completely, pause briefly, and then proceed with caution at each stop sign.

### C. Specific Violations

The following shall be considered as specific violations:

- (1) Parking citations may be received for:
  - (a) Parking in areas bordered in yellow
  - (b) Parking in areas not designated for the decal issued
  - (c) Parking in loading zones
  - (d) Parking in driveway
  - (e) Forging or altering a permit, or using a forged or altered permit
  - (f) Committing any of the following acts with the intension of providing any person with parking privileges to which he is not entitled under these regulations:
    - 1. Transferring a permit
    - 2. Affixing a permit to a vehicle other than that for which it was issued
    - 3. Failing to destroy a permit when required to do so by these regulations
    - 4. Parking or driving a vehicle to which there has been affixed a permit other than that issued for such vehicle, with knowledge thereof
  - (g) Parking on wrong side of street
  - (h) Blocking cross-walk
  - (i) Failing to park within the lines of individually marked spaces
  - (j) Parking on campus when parking privileges have been suspended
  - (k) Altering, damaging, moving, or ignoring University traffic signs or markings
  - (1) Failing to display parking permit in prescribed manner or
  - (m) Failing to obey requests and/or directions of a Campus Security Officer

- (n) Parking in a backed-in position
- (o) Over-parking in a time-limited zone
- (p) Parking an unregistered vehicle
- (2) Moving violations are defined as follows:

(a) Failing to stop before passing stop sign

- (b) Operating motor vehicle in prohibited direction on one-way street or parking lot lanes
- (c) Driving on sidewalks
- (d) Failing to yield right-of-way to pedestrians
- (e) Driving vehicle into barricaded area or removing barricades
- (f) Failing to stop or heed other instructions given by a Campus Security Officer and/or refusing to show drivers license upon request of the officer
- (g) Violating any of the provisions of the Official Texas Motor Vehicle Laws Booklet
- (h) Exceeding speed limit
- (i) Driving in an imprudent manner

### D. Parking Techniques

- (1) Parked vehicles will be positioned so that the whole of the vehicle is located within the boundaries of the parking space. The fact that other vehicles are parked improperly shall not constitute an excuse for parking with any part of the car over the line.
- (2) Where parallel parking is required, vehicles must be parked with right wheels to the curb where two-way traffic is permitted, and on one way streets the automobile must be parked with the front end forward in the direction in which traffic is allowed.
- (3) Where diagonal parking is required, the wheel nearest the curb may not be removed more than 12" from the street face of the curb.
  - (4) No vehicle shall be parked:
    - (a) With rear end to the curb in diagonal parking spaces
    - (b) For periods longer than those specifically designated
    - (c) With double or other forms of multiple p arking

### 5. Miscellaneous

- A. Parking Facilities location: 302 Third Street, Extension 248, 278, or 359
- B. Payment of Reinstatement fees will be made at the Bursar's Office located in the basement of the Library.
- C. Due to the temporary nature of assigned parking areas, erected parking signs take precedence over any issued parking map.
- D. On special occasions and emergencies, parking limitations may be imposed by the Chief, Traffic and Security Services.

The Campus Traffic and Security Chief and selected security officers are duly commissioned peace officers of the State of Texas. Upon request of an officer of The University of Texas at Arlington or of a campus security officer, any person on the campus is required to identify himself with the proper identification.

- 1. Bourland, Agnes T. is presently the Director of Admissions. She is now sixty-five years of age, has been employed at the Medical Branch for twenty-three years, and is presently in good health. Mrs. Bourland will not continue as Director of Admissions but will be re-appointed in a supervisory capacity in the Admitting Office of the Jennie Sealy Hospital.
- 2. Goldstucker, Gertrude is a Medical Records Typist who will be sixty-five years of age in July, 1970. Mrs. Goldstucker has been a Medical Records Typist since October 1, 1956. She is perhaps the most knowledgeable Medical Record Typist at the Medical Branch with the highest per day production. The resultant quality of her work is excellent.
- 3. Grove, Deloris B. is a Clerk-Typist II in the Credit and Collection Division of the Office of Patient Finance. She is presently sixty-five years of age and has been employed with the University of Texas Medical Branch for the past thirteen years as secretary to the Manager of Credit and Collections. Mrs. Grove is in good health and an excellent secretary.
- 4. Opperud, Anna I. is presently a Clerk II in the Accounting Department. Miss Opperud attained her sixty-fifth birthday during the present fiscal year, and she has been employed for the past twenty years with the University of Texas Medical Branch. Her service to this institution has been valuable and she has been a faithful and most dependable employee. Her health is excellent, in fact, during the past eight years she has rarely been off work due to illness.
- 5. Pierson, Alvina L. is presently employed as a Resident Counselor for one of our dormitories and has been employed in that capacity since May of 1960. The dormitory in which she is counselor is occupied primarily by foreign exchange nurses. Mrs. Pierson has, over the years, developed a knowledge and understanding of the customs and habits of these nurses and is able to ease the impact of adjustment of the nurses to this country. She is now seventy years of age and in good health.
- 6. Winkler, Rosemarie C. has attained her sixty-fifth birthday during the present fiscal year. She is presently employed as Technical Director of Histopathology, a position she has held since March 4, 1957. The Department of Pathology is actively seeking a replacement for this position who can be trained to replace Miss Winkler. However, due to a severe shortage of histology technicians with a college degree, a replacement has not been found who is qualified to carry the responsibility of a Technical Director to instruct the Histology Technician Trainees.



<u>CURRICULUM REVISION</u>: I recommend approval of the following changes in the <u>curriculum</u> at The University of Texas Medical Branch as approved by the Faculty of Medicine on May 26, 1970 for implementation in September, 1970:

2495

That a Basic Science Core of four terms, each fifteen weeks in duration be established with assigned time of 22-25 hours per week for basic sciences instruction plus four hours per week assigned to Behavioral Sciences or Introduction to Medicine. Appropriate vacation periods are provided. In addition to the basic disciplines now offered of Anatomy, Biochemistry, Physiology, Pharmacology, Pathology and Microbiology, three new multidisciplinary courses are offered -- Cell Biology, Neurological Sciences, and Endocrinology, as well as an integrated functional laboratory during Term II and IV designed to correlate biochemistry, physiology, pharmacology and pathology.

That a ten week period following Basic Science Core be allotted to a course entitled "Introduction to Clinical Medicine." This period would be devoted to medical problem solving, didactic complements to reading, and clinical ward experience in each of the major clinical departments.

That a course in Behavioral Sciences correlated to subjects in and during the Basic Science Core be covered in forty 3-hour sessions. The Behavioral Sciences would be a continuous component of the clinical experience.

Following four weeks of vacation after the Introduction to Medicine, a Clinical Core would begin consisting of six periods of rotating clerkships containing eight weeks each with 12 weeks on Medicine, 12 weeks on Surgery, 8 weeks on Pediatrics, 8 weeks on Neuropsychiatry and 8 weeks on Obstetrics and Gynecology. The Clinical Core would be followed by eight weeks of vacation.

That certain students be permitted to graduate in three years (the end of Clinical Core) under all the conditions of:

- 1. Screening of applicants by a faculty committee basing judgment on the student's academic performance, personal integrity, maturity and clinical ability.
- 2. Application and acceptance of a University internship or residency or an additional postdoctoral year in a medical science.
- 3. Final award of certification of the M.D. degree be delayed until satisfactory completion of this additional year.

That those students not graduating in three years select one of the following broad disciplines as his fourth year: (a) clinical specialty, (b) family medicine, (c) graduate school. These Track programs designed with assistance of the faculty, will be six 8-week segments of which no less than one 8-week period be spent in some form of direct patient contact, and one 8-week period on optional vacation. Any segment or all the Track year may be spent off campus with approval of the advisor and the Dean.

The curriculum described above will provide opportunities for interdisciplinary correlation, early introduction of patient contact, application of the behavioral sciences and possible three year graduation or a fourth year designed for the special interests of the student's future medical career goals.

CONTRACTS AND AGREEMENTS: The following agreement has been negotiated by the Associate Dean for Business Affairs and signed by the Dean. I recommend your approval and ratification of the signature.
