Adriana B. Nunemaker, MA is the Executive Director for the University of Texas System Education and Research Center at Laredo. She brings to the position more than twenty-five years of combined education and health care experience which have established her as a leader in education and an advocate for quality health care throughout South Texas.

Prior to joining the University of Texas System, Adriana worked for Laredo College where she served as Dean of the South Campus. Her role was to direct the day-to-day operations of all campus activities. As Dean of the South Campus, Adriana worked with a team of Laredo College administrators to coordinate various vaccine drives at the Laredo College South Campus. Laredo, Texas was designated as one of the country's worst coronavirus hot spots in early 2021. Laredo

College faculty, staff, nursing, and allied health students assisted in this initiative.

In 2018, Adriana was appointed Professor of Allied Health and Programs Director in the Health Sciences Division. At Laredo Medical Center, Adriana served as Director of Education where her primary role was to develop policies, procedures, and training modules for employees.

At the onset of her educational career, Adriana worked at United Independent School District as a middle school teacher where she advised and mentored numerous students. She remains in contact with some of her former students who have now become successful health care professionals.
